Multi-Modal Learning	- Do our AP students have access to a true hybrid learning model that combines digital flexibility with physical deep-dive resources? - Are students equipped with comprehensive print materials—like Barron's AP prep books—to facilitate active recall, screen-free focus, and tactile annotation? Implementation Flexibility	- Can our advanced academic curriculum seamlessly adapt to diverse scheduling demands, from full-classroom, teacher-led instruction to asynchronous independent study for non-traditional or under-enrolled courses? - Is our AP resource suite integrated into an LMS to ensure frictionless access as well as data tracking and assignment submission?
