- 3. A large group is defined as a medical group or health system with 150 or more FTE physicians.
- 4. Improvement is based on self-reported data submitted to the campaign and is measured as the percentage improvement on the diabetes bundle measure in one year.
- 5. Honorable mention recognizes the best performance among participating organizations whose self-reported data is limited to blood sugar control rates.
