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This week, from August 18-21, the Disability
 Royal Commission is holding a special
 event, which is called a hearing.

A hearing is where lots of people tell their stories, to help the Royal Commission understand a situation.

 Coronavirus has been making people sick.

 This hearing will include people with disability, the government and service providers like Life Without Barriers.



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It is good and fair that lots of people have their say, so that the Royal Commission can help recommend ways to protect you from the virus.
