





Three years into marriage, Aimee and Jeremy Mahoney talked seriously for the first time about kids. He had always wanted them. She didn't. For months, they disagreed over their family's future.


"Our community spoke so much truth to us during that hard time," said Aimee. Men in Jeremy's life encouraged him to go to Aimee and ask for her forgiveness for his part in their conflict. Even though Jeremy couldn't imagine a life without kids, he went home and got on his knees, and begged Aimee's forgiveness. They reconciled, and Aimee agreed to spend time seeking God on what He wanted for their family.


She read the story of Gabriel's announcement to Mary that she would give birth to the Messiah (Luke 1: 26-38). Mary's response changed Aimee's life: "I am the Lord's servant; may it be to me as you have said."

"Mary basically says, 'I want to show my obedience, trust, and faithfulness by being God's servant,' Aimee reflected. "I was convicted I was being selfish. I knew motherhood would make me die to myself, and I didn't want that. It was through Mary's story that I finally surrendered to God and said, 'I want to be your servant.'"

Nothing about the journey was easy. The Mahoneys spent four years in and out of fertility clinics. On April 15, 2019, just a few weeks into Aimee's first pregnancy, they found out their baby had no heartbeat. They grieved their child's death, but they prayed and held on to hope, both surrendering to what God wanted. On April 15, 2020, they got another positive pregnancy test. That December, they welcomed baby Addison into their family.

Now, Aimee often looks back on what resonated for her in Mary's story. "People are often discontent with what the Lord doesn't give them. I had to learn to be content with what the Lord wanted to give me—a family. I hope others see in me a willingness to truly be God's humble servant, whether or not He gives what I want. I hope that inspires others to want the same."





27 years old, I came to the end of my rope. Although I learned about Jesus through Young Life in high school, I didn't know how to apply the Bible to my life, so I found myself in a cycle of sin patterns as a young adult. I was wrapped up in the party scene, alcohol, and jumping from one unhealthy relationship to another with men trying to find validation. When a job opportunity with my company opened up in Dallas, I was quick to say yes.

"I can see now that the Lord was done watching me fumble. He pulled me out of my environment in North Carolina and gave me a new start in Dallas. It felt like the Lord was quieting my life. My friend who invited me to Young Life in high school now lived in Dallas and encouraged me to get involved in a local church. The Lord was helping me say yes in little ways to grow in my relationship with Him.

"God changed my life and taught me what faithfulness looked like through community and participation at Watermark and The Porch, Watermark's young adult ministry. It was such a fun season, but things shifted as I got older. Faithfulness and serving Jesus didn't look like being in a 'fun' or 'high visibility' ministry anymore, but it still required small daily obedient actions. Again, God gave me time to be quiet and ask through prayer what He wanted from me next.


"I consistently told God my desires to be a mom and be married. I asked Him more and more how He wanted me to be obedient in this new season. My community group helped me prayerfully consider the possibility of fostering a child. I kept pushing this idea back to God and my community group out of fear and uncertainty, but it became clear that I was stalling on something the Lord was calling me to do.

"I specifically asked in my prayers to God, Have I defined 'motherhood' incorrectly? I wanted to make sure that my definition of motherhood matched God's definition. I always thought motherhood was getting married and having biological babies. But I realized that I was defining motherhood by the world's standards and not by God and His Word. My intentional time with the Lord helped me see other areas I was also

defining on my own terms and not from Scripture. How do I define 'love'? How do I define 'fun'?

"Fast forward to now - after prayerful consideration, conversation, and trainings, I am now a foster mom. Foster parenting doesn't make sense on paper for me. I am 37, single, working, and I have a newborn. I don't have everything perfectly planned out. I haven't done this before. I don't know how I'll be emotionally if she goes back to her parents, but there is a God that knows. He knows every detail. This process has helped me grow in my faith and trust with the Lord, and He has reassured me time and time again that He has everything covered. Finally, I am saying yes in obedience because I trust Him.

"If you feel God has put something in your heart, pray about it and act on it. Obedience to the Lord can be scary. You need people that know God's Word, know you, love you, and care about you to say, 'Go! You need to move forward."
