A Story of Faith

The impact of studying God's word together is powerful, transformative, and life-giving. Women's Bible Study provides a space for women of all ages in all seasons to come together and grow in their faith. It is so much more than Bible reading. In WBS, women join one another to learn truth, sharing their hurts and their hopes in a community of grace and love. It is a time of fellowship and discipleship. In WBS, women not only hear truth spoken from the stage, but have the opportunity to dive deeper in the lesson in small groups. This time of encouragement is a gift to glean wisdom from women in different seasons of life, women whose stories are both remarkably different from their own and stories that feel very familiar. Together, in the most vibrant setting, women get to come together with the sole purpose of teaching, sharing, and knowing the love of Jesus, hearts and lives lit afire for His glory. Growing up Muslim, Eman didn't feel safe. Leaving the faith is a dishonor and disgrace to one's entire family, however, in her heart she always felt something was missing.

In Arabic, Eman literally means faith, and upon moving to the United States she was surrounded by people who claimed Christianity as their faith. Hearing about this Jesus that she only knew as a prophet, she bought a bible to learn about Him on her own. But it was a friend's invitation to

Acts that Paul was not afraid. And if he could be changed and live a life without fear, I could, too. I knew that I needed to say out loud what I believed in my heart.” For Eman, the difference in an online bible study and WBS was in the personal connectivity. “There is a sweetness to WBS. The teaching, the table time, and the kids’ ministry for my children. I feel alive! It is evident that this ministry is built on God’s love and people running the same race together.” Eman no longer lives in fear. Her favorite verse from Psalm 119, “I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you,” is evidence of her trust and faithfulness to her King and Creator. In memorizing God’s Word and living for His glory, the Lord has used her as an instrument of change in her husband’s heart. No longer an atheist, together they are seeking the Lord together with Eman getting to serve in WBS and her husband being baptized this year. The friendships she gained in WBS are invaluable to her, a boon to her faith. “My time in Women’s Bible Study continues to be a wonderful extension of God’s love, a place of great wisdom and incredible beauty.”
