

# **Bridges To Life**

Healing Crime Victims. Rehabilitating Offenders. Making Our Communities Safer.

#### Who We Are

Bridges To Life (BTL) is a faith-based, restorative justice program for incarcerated men and women that reduces recidivism among program graduates and helps make our communities safer. BTL accomplishes this mission by utilizing a unique 14-week curriculum centered on *victim impact* and facilitated by volunteers. **Over 55,000 offenders have graduated from the BTL program since inception, with the help of more than 3,100 volunteers.** Bridges To Life has been conducted in 184 facilities, and its curriculum has been used in 14 states and 6 foreign countries.

## In 2020, the Bridges To Life program was conducted in 105 prisons and alternative facilities, providing services to over 8,000 participants.

#### Why We're Needed

The goal of the BTL program is to effect a transformation in the minds and hearts of offenders so that, once released, they will not return to their former life of crime. This reduction in recidivism has significant economic and societal impact, saving taxpayer dollars and making our communities safer. The cost to the taxpayer to incarcerate an offender in a Texas prison over the length of the average sentence is approximately \$105,000, and that is without the collateral costs of judicial process prior to incarceration.

### The 5-year average program cost of Bridges To Life is just \$208 per graduate!

#### What We've Accomplished

Recidivism studies conducted by BTL with the assistance of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice reveal that **over 83% of BTL graduates do not return to prison within three years after release.** Most recently, a 2020 National Police Foundation independent research study compared the recidivism rates of a group of parolees who had taken the BTL program during their incarceration with those who had not. Participation in the BTL program decreased the odds of recidivism by 30%. Furthermore, only 1.4% of BTL parolees were re-incarcerated for a violent crime, compared to 3.7% of the non-BTL group.

### This equates to a 62% reduction in those returning to prison for a violent crime.
