THE IMPORTANCE OF SCRIPTURE

II Timothy 3

16All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, **17**so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

II Timothy 4:2 Preach the Word. Be prepared both in season and out of season. Correct rebuke and encourage with great patience and careful instruction

Romans 15:4 For everything was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.

Proverbs30

5 "Every word of God is flawless; he is a shield to those who take refuge in him.

Psalm 119 (entire length of Psalm emphasizes the wisdom of scripture)

- **1** Blessed are they whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the LORD.**2** Blessed are they who keep his statutes and seek him with all their heart. **3** They do nothing wrong; they walk in his ways.
- **4** You have laid down precepts that are to be fully obeyed.
- **5** Oh, that my ways were steadfast in obeying your decrees!
- **6** Then I would not be put to shame when I consider all your commands.**7** I will praise you with an upright heart as I learn your righteous laws. **8** I will obey your decrees; do not utterly forsake me.

FOR PRODIGALS

How we can make change for the better:

#1. Making change begins with a vision of who God wants you to be 2 Corinthians 5:17;

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation, the old has gone, the new has come!

Psalm 119:

9 How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to your word **10** I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands.**11** I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you **12** Praise be to you, O LORD; teach me your decrees.**13** With my lips I recount all the laws that come from your mouth **14** I rejoice in following your statutes as one rejoices in great riches.**15** I meditate on your precepts and consider your ways.**16** I delight in your

decrees; I will not neglect your word.

#2. Making change involves seeing yourself as God does.

Genesis 1:26;

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness, and let them rule over the fish of the sea and birds of the air, over the livestock, over all the creatures that move along the ground

1 Corinthians 6: 19-20:

Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body.

Ephesians 2:10;

For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

2 Corinthians 8:9;

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.

#3. Making change means becoming a person of discipline.

Philippians 3: 10, 12;

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, Not that I have already obtained all this or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me.

John 14:15:

(Jesus said) If you love me, you will obey what I command.

Romans 12:1-2;

Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God-this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is-his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12(need for accountability)

Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work: If one falls down his friend can help him up. But pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up! Also if two lie down together they will keep warm but how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves, a cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

1 Timothy 4:8;

For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come.

#4. Change is sustained by participating in an accountable, loving Christian environment.

Acts 2:42:

They devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

1 Corinthians 15:33:

Do not be misled; "Bad company corrupts good character."

Matthew 18:20:

(Jesus said) For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them.

Hebrews 10:24-25;

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another- and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Proverbs 3 (The Rewards of Wisdom)

1My son, do not forget my teaching, But let your heart keep my commandments; 2For length of days and years of life And peace they will add to you. 3Do not let kindness and truth leave you; Bind them around your neck, Write them on the tablet of your heart. 4So you will find favor and good repute In the sight of God and man. 5Trust in the LORD with all your heart And do not lean on your own understanding. 6In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He will make your paths straight. 7Do not be wise in your own eyes; Fear the LORD and turn away from evil. 8It will be healing to your body And refreshment to your bones. 9Honor the LORD from your wealth And from the first of all your produce; 10So your barns will be filled with plenty And your vats will overflow with new wine. 11My son, do not reject the discipline of the LORD Or loathe His reproof, 12For whom the LORD loves He reproves, Even as a father corrects the son in whom he delights.

Proverbs 29 (Warnings and Instructions)

1A man who hardens his neck after much reproof will suddenly be broken beyond remedy. **3**A man who loves wisdom makes his father glad, But he who keeps company with harlots wastes his wealth.

Proverbs 12 (Contrast the Upright and the Wicked)

1Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge. But he who hates reproof is stupid.

Proverbs 15

5A fool rejects his father's discipline, But he who regards reproof is sensible.**10**Grievous punishment is for him who forsakes the way; He who hates reproof will die.**14**The mind of the intelligent seeks knowledge, But the mouth of fools feeds on folly.**20**A wise son makes a father glad, But a foolish man despises his mother.

Proverbs 4(A Father's Instruction)

1Hear, O sons, the instruction of a father, And give attention that you may gain understanding, 2For I give you sound teaching; Do not abandon my instruction. **3**When I was a son to my father, Tender and the only son in the sight of my mother. 4Then he taught me and said to me. "Let your heart hold fast my words: Keep my commandments and live; 5Acquire wisdom! Acquire understanding! Do not forget nor turn away from the words of my mouth. 6"Do not forsake her, and she will guard you; Love her, and she will watch over you. 7"The beginning of wisdom is: Acquire wisdom; And with all your acquiring, get understanding. 8"Prize her, and she will exalt you; She will honor you if you embrace her. 9"She will place on your head a garland of grace; She will present you with a crown of beauty." 10Hear, my son, and accept my sayings And the years of your life will be many. 11I have directed you in the way of wisdom; I have led you in upright paths. 12When you walk, your steps will not be impeded; And if you run, you will not stumble. 13Take hold of instruction; do not let go Guard her, for she is your life. 14Do not enter the path of the wicked And do not proceed in the way of evil men. **15**Avoid it, do not pass by it; Turn away from it and pass on. **16**For they cannot sleep unless they do evil; And they are robbed of sleep unless they make someone stumble. 17For they eat the bread of wickedness And drink the wine of violence. **18**But the path of the righteous is like the light of dawn, That shines brighter and brighter until the full day. 19 The way of the wicked is like darkness; They do not know over what they stumble. 20My son, give attention to my words; Incline your ear to my savings. 21Do not let them depart from your sight. Keep them in the midst of your heart. 22For they are life to those who find them. And health to all their body. **23**Watch over your heart with all diligence, For from it flow the springs of life. 24Put away from you a deceitful mouth And put devious speech far from you. 25Let your eyes look directly ahead And let your gaze be fixed straight in front of you. **26**Watch the path of your feet And all your ways will be established. 27Do not turn to the right nor to the left; Turn your foot from evil.

Proverbs 2 (The Pursuit of Wisdom Brings Security)

1My son, if you will receive my words And treasure my commandments within you, **2**Make your ear attentive to wisdom, Incline your heart to understanding; **3**For if you cry for discernment, Lift your voice for understanding; **4**If you seek her

as silver And search for her as for hidden treasures; 5Then you will discern the fear of the LORD And discover the knowledge of God. 6For the LORD gives wisdom; From His mouth come knowledge and understanding. 7He stores up sound wisdom for the upright; He is a shield to those who walk in integrity, **8**Guarding the paths of justice. And He preserves the way of His godly ones. 9Then you will discern righteousness and justice And equity and every good course. 10 For wisdom will enter your heart, And knowledge will be pleasant to your soul; 11Discretion will guard you, Understanding will watch over you, 12To deliver you from the way of evil, From the man who speaks perverse things; **13**From those who leave the paths of uprightnes To walk in the ways of darkness; 14Who delight in doing evil And rejoice in the perversity of evil; 15Whose paths are crooked, And who are devious in their ways;16To deliver you from the strange woman. From the adulteress who flatters with her words; 17That leaves the companion of her youth And forgets the covenant of her God; 18 For her house sinks down to death And her tracks lead to the dead; **19**None who go to her return again, Nor do they reach the paths of life. **20**So you will walk in the way of good men And keep to the paths of the righteous.

Proverbs 13 :Contrast the Upright and the Wicked

1A wise son accepts his father's discipline, But a scoffer does not listen to rebuke.

13The one who despises the word will be in debt to it, But the one who fears the commandment will be rewarded. **14**The teaching of the wise is a fountain of life, To turn aside from the snares of death. **18**Poverty and shame will come to him who neglects discipline, But he who regards reproof will be honored.

Proverbs 10

8 The wise in heart accept commands, but a chattering fool comes to ruin **9** The man of integrity walks securely, but he who takes crooked paths will be found out.

Proverbs 16
