
T H E COLLECTIVE

Pray God would help us to see Jesus' face in the eyes of every homeless person we meet so that we may be empowered through word and deed, and through all the means we have, to bring justice and peace to those who are homeless. Thank God that even in times of need, despair, and brokenness, He is there. Pray He would put His arms around children and families in extreme poverty so they feel comfort and hope; that He would meet their needs both physically and spiritually. And Lord, guide us so we can be your hands and feet pursuing justice for the poor and upholding the cause of the needy. (Psalm 140:12)

WK3 OUR CITY:

INITIATIVES FOR LIFE


Pray that abortion would end today - that laws would be changed and abortion clinic doors would be closed. Pray for all who work for an end to abortion or to defend life, that they might be strengthened by prayer, and that God might reward them for their goodness. Pray for expectant mothers considering abortion, that they would choose life for their unborn child, and that they'd

find hope and healing in Christ. Pray for protection and safety of unborn children and pray that the Heartbeat bill would stay in effect and reach full execution! Pray that all who know the Lord would have radical compassion for those in situations of unplanned pregnancies, while loving them and leading them towards life for their child. Pray for women who have already chosen to give up their children to abortion, that they'd know and accept the forgiveness of Christ, find healing in His name, and that they'd be vulnerable to share their story and proclaim the same hope to others that are wrestling with the choice of life (Jeremiah 1:4-5, Isaiah 49:1b, 1 Corinthians 16:14)

WK4LOCALINTERNATIONAL

Lord, we pray that you'd revive the Church and awaken our nation to Your greatness and supremacy. We thank you that Dallas continues to be one of our country's top destinations for immigrants and those seeking asylum. Would you continue to unite us and create friendships amongst us despite our differences? We pray you'd open our eyes and hearts as You give us unique opportunities to share the gospel to all of the nations of the world and to love our neighbors. Teach us to be compassionate and bold as we create friendships and help connect them to Christ and the local Church. We pray for the international students in our own backyard, that you'd continue to provide ways for us to support refugees, and that You'd show us ways to serve our local international friends in unique ways.


"I was living in a false reality. It wasn't until I acknowledged my need for help and began to start my path to healing that I began to find life and freedom from my past.


"The love, care, and faithfulness of God's people led me to Watermark's recovery ministry, re:generation. God used a community of individuals as a vessel to grow me closer to Him, deepen my understanding of true biblical fellowship, and learn more about God's character. I had my first glimpses of biblical community as I watched believers speak truth into my life, encourage, and support me.

"Through the tools I gained in reading God's Word, as well as resources from re:generation, God began to transform my heart to fully surrender to His Will. My past no longer defines me. This gives me courage and hope to serve, love, and walk alongside other women who need to experience the same transformation.

"Now, I can rest in knowing that through Jesus I am made new, an adopted daughter, and heir to my Father's Kingdom. He isn't finished. He is still in control and can be trusted with my fears, my desire, hope, joy, and disappointment.

"Discovering God's great love for me has given my heart now a new passion to care for others. I love serving through the Community Development Corporation (CDC). Our mission is to transform the economic welfare of our city and to ensure every person has dignity, is developed to their full potential, and is discipled through equipping and empowering them in skills, resources, and opportunities they may not have had otherwise. God can use anyone to do anything. All we must do is be willing to see His children the way He does, love them, engage with them, and use the opportunities He has blessed us with to help remove barriers.





I wanted people around me, especially those I admired and respected, to think highly of me. I wanted to portray only strength, which led to me hiding any weaknesses from view. Everything was about me - I was building my own little kingdom rather than God's Kingdom. It was an exhausting way to live.

"I grew up with two different kinds of people proclaiming Jesus in my life. Sadly, many were held captive to legalism, religiosity, and like me, rule-following for the sake of appearances. But by the grace of God, others were beautiful reflections of Jesus, namely my mom and grandma. My mom was the one who led me to Christ after I asked loads of questions on the way home from church one Sunday, about hell and heaven and living with God forever. Admittedly, the

thought of separation from God for eternity terrified me as a kid, but underneath it all was a deep desire to be fully loved and fully accepted. I'm so deeply thankful for the marking of that initial moment of faith - the recognition that in the car on that day, there was a shift in my little soul forevermore toward trust and hope in the truth of the gospel through the power of the Spirit. I wish I could tell you that my struggles with pride, people-pleasing, and hiding sin ended on that day, but they didn't. It was the beginning of a journey to learn to let Jesus call me back when my heart wants to wander toward things that seem shiny in the moment but are truly painful.

"I began to see this tested as my family walked through some challenging seasons during my more formative years. I was angry with God for interrupting my childhood with some horrific things like addiction and financial ruin. Eventually, I came to the end of myself, and Jesus was still there, ready to turn those hurts into compassion and weaknesses into empathy. I didn't realize it at the time, but the adversity in my life was the very thing that prepared my heart to serve. As I got older, I began to see how God has used the experiences of my life to drive me to my next endeavor. From my early days in politics, to fighting injustice with International Justice Mission, to my current role with Prison Fellowship, I have found that the most rewarding seasons have been those in which my heart is not preoccupied with building my own kingdom, but the Lord's. The beginning of Isaiah 61 shows me that the extraordinary thing about God's redemptive, restorative nature is the way He takes our areas of deepest struggle, most painful wounds, and bestows on us a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair (Isaiah 61:3). I just want to be a part of bringing the beauty of God's restoration to our world.

As the decades have passed, the Lord has generously showed me His beauty and goodness. Equally, in the loneliest and scariest, or most joyful and wonderful seasons of life, He has rerouted my love of building my own kingdom. He has shifted my desire to be about bringing His Kingdom to bear on our broken, longing, and yet still beautifully created world. He's continually drawing my heart toward His Story, and in His Story, I've found my story too.
