- ☐ Guided hike along the coast of Hudson Bay. *Learn about the different flora and fauna and spot the historic MV Ithaca shipwreck from the shoreline.*
- □ Exclusive Churchill and area tours to local and historical points of interest. *Stops include the Itsanitaq Museum, which houses one of the most extensive collections of Inuit art worldwide, and the Parks Canada Visitor Centre, where you will step back in time to learn more about the area's wildlife and its remarkable history of the fur trade.*
- □ Wildlife watching on a private Tundra Buggy® tour in the Churchill Wildlife Management Area. *Enjoy dinner on the tundra while watching a beautiful sunset over the horizon.*
- Private guided Zodiac excursion of the Churchill River and estuary to experience the largest beluga whale population in the world at surface level.
- Choice of kayak or paddleboard adventure on the Churchill River. Explore the estuary alongside beluga whale pods.
