Jesse Owens

Jesse Owens is a famous athlete known for his incredible achievements in track and field. He was born on September 12, 1913, in Oakville, Alabama, USA. His real name is James Cleveland Owens, but he was called Jesse by a teacher who misunderstood his name because of his accent.

Jesse Owens grew up in a big family with six brothers and three sisters. In 1922, his family moved to Cleveland, Ohio, for better opportunities. Owens discovered his love for running in school where his coach supported him to practice before classes.

Owens attended Ohio State University and became known as the "Buckeye Bullet." He set multiple world records in 1935 during a Big Ten track event. His most remarkable achievement came in the 1936 Berlin Olympics where he won four gold medals in the 100 meters, 200 meters, long jump, and 4x100 meters relay. This performance shattered Adolf Hitler's belief in Aryan supremacy.

Despite his Olympic success, Owens faced racial discrimination back home in the USA. He worked various jobs to support his family and later became a public speaker and goodwill ambassador. Jesse Owens passed away on March 31, 1980, but his legacy as a track and field legend continues to inspire many.
