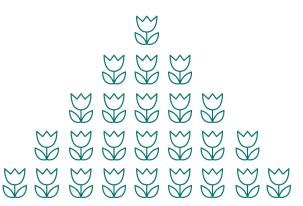

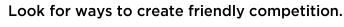
Who is a promotion superstar?

Send 3 Key Emails

Be sure to include a link to your promotion page.

- 1. Fundraiser introduction (include any community drop-off event days)
- 2. Community collection day announcement
- 3. Collection ending soon reminder



Fill the Bags and Boxes

- Consolidate donations to "stuff" the bags.
- Full bags help you stay on track to meet your goal.
- Tightly pack boxes with household goods.







Sharing Digitally Delivers

- Share, share! Post frequently on social media and keep it fresh.
- Use pictures (not just bags) to show who you are fundraising for and how the donations will make a difference.

Finding Storage Successes

- Nonprofit organizations like to work with car dealerships to be a drop off spot and house donations.
- Some storage facilities will donate space or offer a discounted rate for nonprofits.
- Local businesses often enjoy supporting community-based nonprofits. Some have storage space available and others are happy to be a drop spot for donations.
