Which safeguarding training should you attend first?

- Although you can attend any training in any order, we recommend that all practitioners should attend the **Introduction to Safeguarding** course, the **Partnership Approach to Domestic Abuse** course and the **MAPPA Awareness Raising Session**. They provide a foundation for understanding multi-agency processes and pathways in Stockport. They also consider learning from local and national safeguarding reviews, legislation and guidance and impact on practice.
- In addition, we offer courses on emerging themes from our safeguarding reviews around neglect and child sexual abuse.
- We would also recommend that everyone should attend our learning circle. Learning circle information is found in this booklet but please look out for updates and new sessions throughout the year, advertised via our partnership networks.

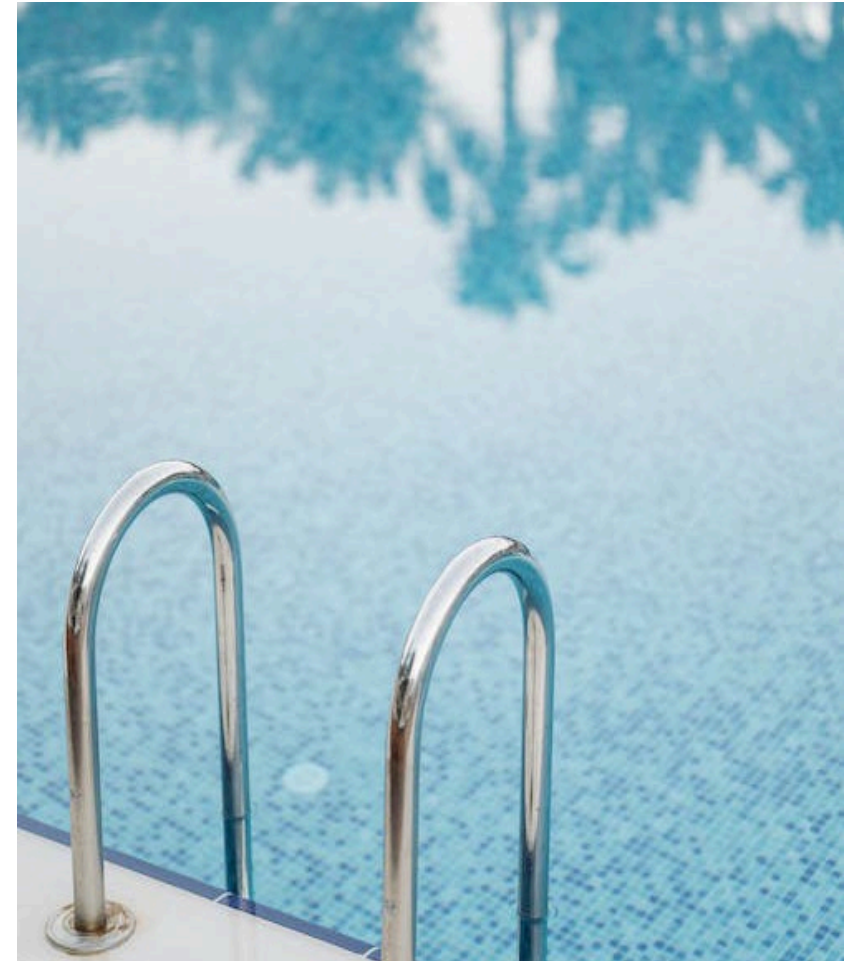
Multi Agency Safeguarding Training Pool

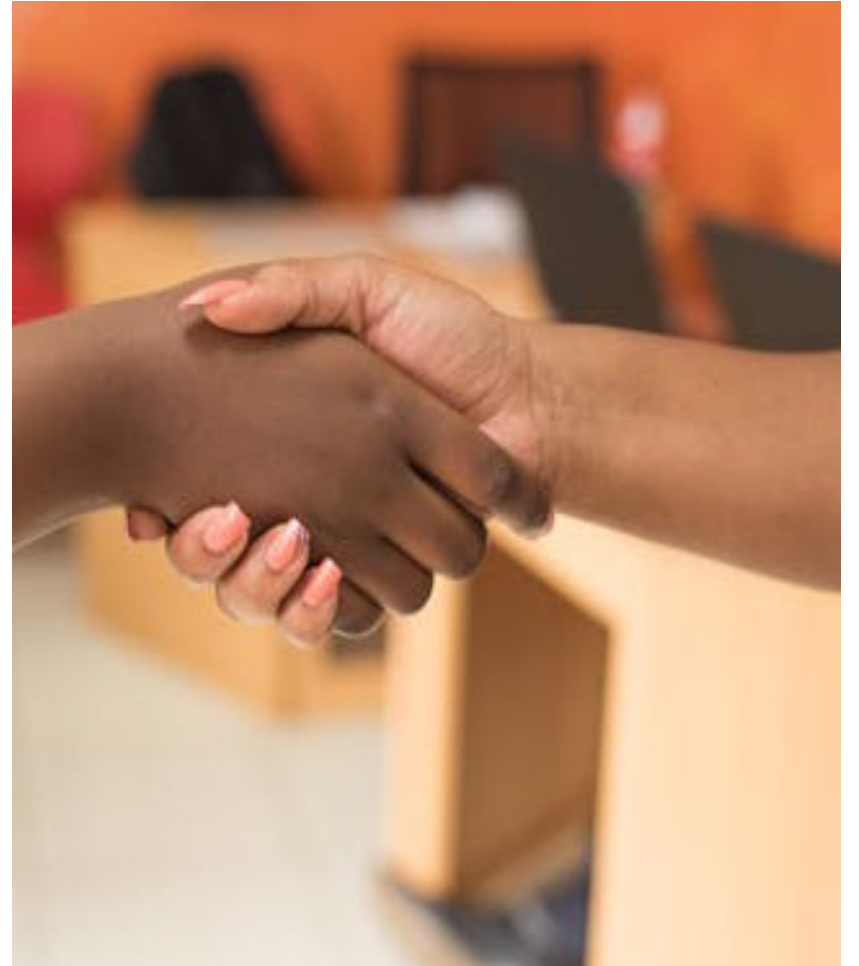
Introduction to Safeguarding Children (Half Day)

This 3-hour course is an introduction to safeguarding and covers legal background, recognition and response and how safeguarding is integral to the common processes approach in Stockport. It covers recognition of the signs and symptoms of child abuse and how to respond appropriately. This session is recommended for workers, who have not previously completed any safeguarding training, are new to Stockport or who have not completed this course recently and want to update.

A Partnership Approach To Domestic Abuse

This course is aimed at all practitioners working with children and families and adult services.

This updated full day course is aimed at all practitioners working with adults and children. It aims to raise practitioners understanding of domestic abuse and what signs to look for.

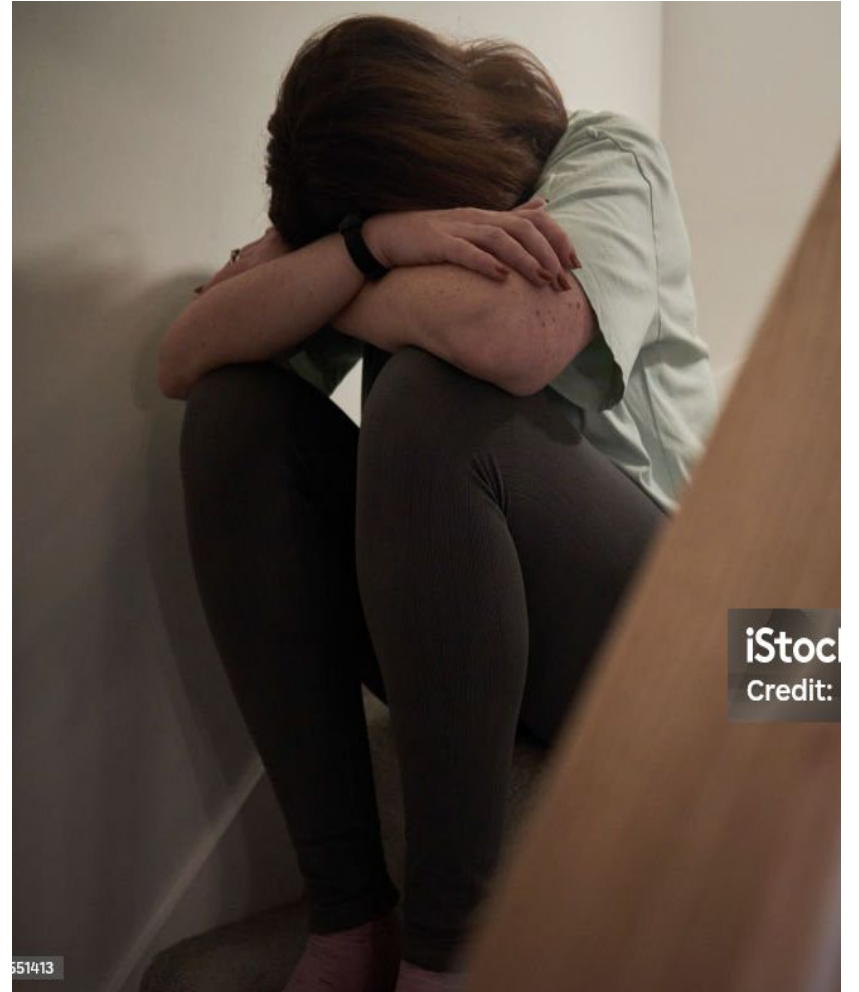
The course also explains the MARAC process and how to complete referrals and risk assessments.

It covers definitions and legislation, how to recognise potential indicators, how to respond, ask questions using the risk assessment tool (DASH/RIC), how to get support and refer via Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC).

Safeguarding Children and Adults: Multi Agency Public Protection (MAPPA) Awareness Raising Session

Developing An Understanding Of Child Sexual Abuse

This is a new **2-day course** created by the NSPCC and delivered by a range of practitioners from Stockport Safeguarding Children's Partnership including Social workers, Health Professionals, Early Help and Youth Justice. The sessions have been created following local and national rapid reviews and Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews (CSPR's) where sexual abuse has been a factor in children and young people suffering significant harm. **Attendees will need to attend both days. The sessions will allow attendees to:**

- Identify the various types of child sexual abuse (CSA)
 - Utilise appropriate language when referring to or speaking about CSA
 - Recognise the vast and complex issues within the research based around CSA
 - Determine ways to support most vulnerable groups at risk for CSA
 - Identify the ways child sexual abuse can impact children, their families, and society
 - Recall the 4 R's and understand your roles and responsibilities (Recognise, Respond, Report, Record)
 - Summarise and share best practice with other professionals within their network

Safeguarding Children Working with Neglect, the Graded Care Profile 2 (GCP2) and “A Day In The Life” tool.

Neglect features highly as a factor in referrals and interventions for young people in Stockport and nationally.

This one-day workshop explores the topic of Neglect and introduces the Graded Care Profile 2, the only national, standardised and evidenced based assessment tool. It enables practitioners to work restoratively with families in identifying areas of parenting where there are strengths as well as areas where change is needed. Stockport have invested in the tool for use by multi-agency practitioners working with children and families across the continuum of need. There will also be reference to other tools which practitioner's can use, such as A day In The Life) There will also be a focus on the Stockport Safeguarding Childrens Partnerships new Neglect strategy and toolkit for practitioners.

To be able to use the GCP 2 practitioners must attend and complete this course.

Multi-agency Chronology and genogram training

This training is offered to all multi-agency practitioners working with children to support the development of their skills in constructing systemic genograms and impact chronologies. The aims of the course are to upskill the wider children's workforce to complete systemic genograms that support our understanding of the stories in families, child and family's history, intergenerational trauma, family scripts and patterns, and to help us understand important people in the family network.

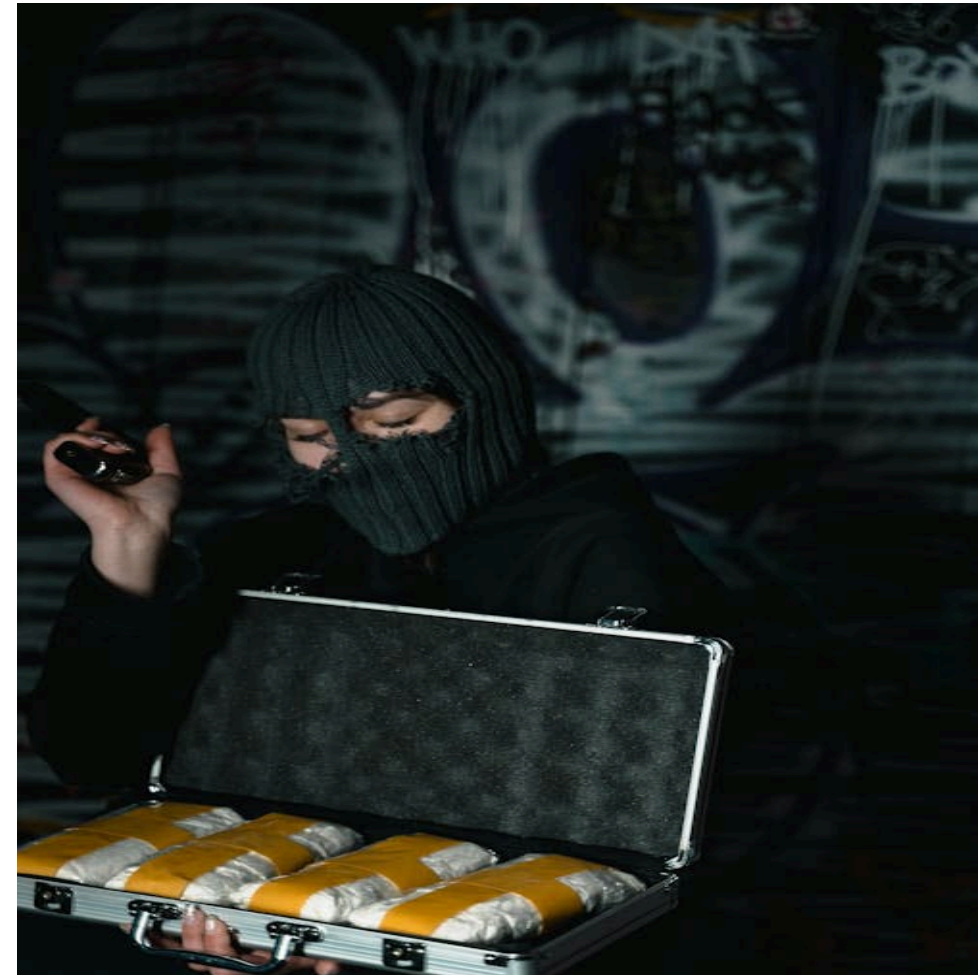
Safeguarding Children: Understanding Exploitation overview of complex safeguarding



This course is suitable for anyone working with children or adults where there may be issues relating to complex safeguarding. The course is delivered by members of ASPIRE, Stockport's complex safeguarding multi-disciplinary team, and covers identification of forms of abuse such as child criminal exploitation. The course also examines the impact of trauma and the impact of this on young people and adults.

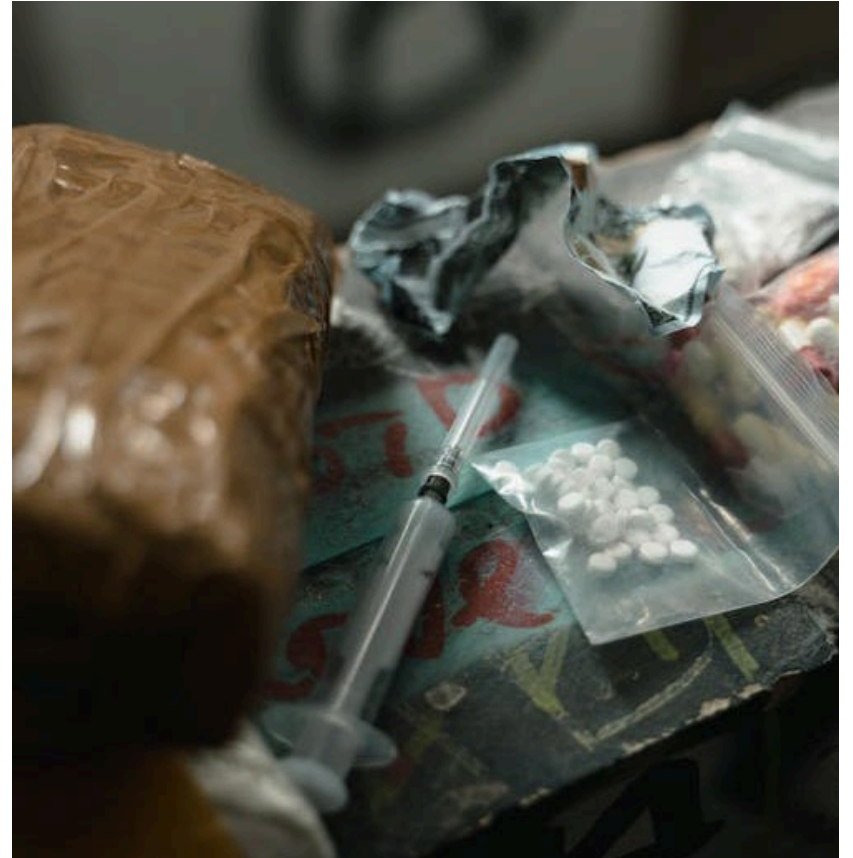
Working with Fathers and Men

- This course has been developed by members of the Stockport COMPASS social work team and The Caring Dads Team and follows up on lessons learned and recommendations from the published report by the Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel, *The Myth of Invisible Men* (publishing.service.gov.uk). In addition to this there has been lots of work across the partnership in Stockport around the topic of working with men and fathers, including a focus as part of Stockport Family Week, plus learning circles by the SSCP training team and the authors of the following reports from east Anglia University “Counting Fathers In” (2017) and “Up Against It” (2021). Both looking at fathers’ experiences of the child protection systems.
- There is a strong message within the research that involving fathers and men is “essential to improving children’s wellbeing” (CSPRP 2021).
- This session is open to anyone working with children, families or adults who would like to learn about ways to engage men and fathers.

Safeguarding Children Where There is Parental Substance Misuse

- This training is an opportunity to understand the needs of children living with parents who misuse substances, by exploring risk factors and the multiple protective factors children need to buffer against the negative impact of parental substance misuse. The voices of children remain at the heart of this training, and it is through understanding their lived experience that the principles for practice are presented.
Many frontline practitioners often feel de-skilled when it comes to substance use, this training will support you in your practice to increase your confidence to have timely and sensitive conversations with parents and children at the earliest opportunity.
- It is a statutory requirement for frontline practitioners to be alert to the needs of children living with parental substance misuse. This training will improve your confidence to confidently identify risk and protective factors, to inform assessments and practice interventions.
- This course is for all frontline practitioners supporting children and adults, where parental substance misuse is a safeguarding concern.

Early Help Assessment- Effective Use (EHA)

- This course focuses on effective engagement, assessment and planning skills in June 25th, 2024 relation to the Early Help Assessment. It explores key areas including overcoming barriers to engagement, quality of and importance of recording, effective engagement with families, making the most of TAF meetings and ensuring the voice of the child is central and visible. The programme runs from September to July each year.

Attendees will be more familiar with when and how to complete an EHA and the importance of quality recording.

Perinatal and Infant Mental Health (PIMH) Multidisciplinary Training

- Facilitated by the Infant Parent mental health Team, the training aims to address the fundamental requirements for all those working with parents and families in the perinatal period to manage and assess severity of perinatal mental health on the infant, parent, their family and society. You will gain knowledge of interventions and local and national services available and to know when to refer on.
- The 1-day training will cover:
 - Mental health conditions in the perinatal period: signs, symptoms and impact on the infant, the family, and the parent infant relationship.
 - Infant Mental Health and the voice of the infant.
 - Identification, assessment, and intervention.
 - Identifying and managing risk associated with PIMH related to suicide and safeguarding.
 - Developing high quality integrated and inclusive service

Safeguarding Children: "Big Deal" Awareness of Problem Gambling and Young People - ONLINE TRAINING

- This free short course is provided by Beacon Counselling Trust, a Northwest based organisation who provide support to problem gamblers of all ages. 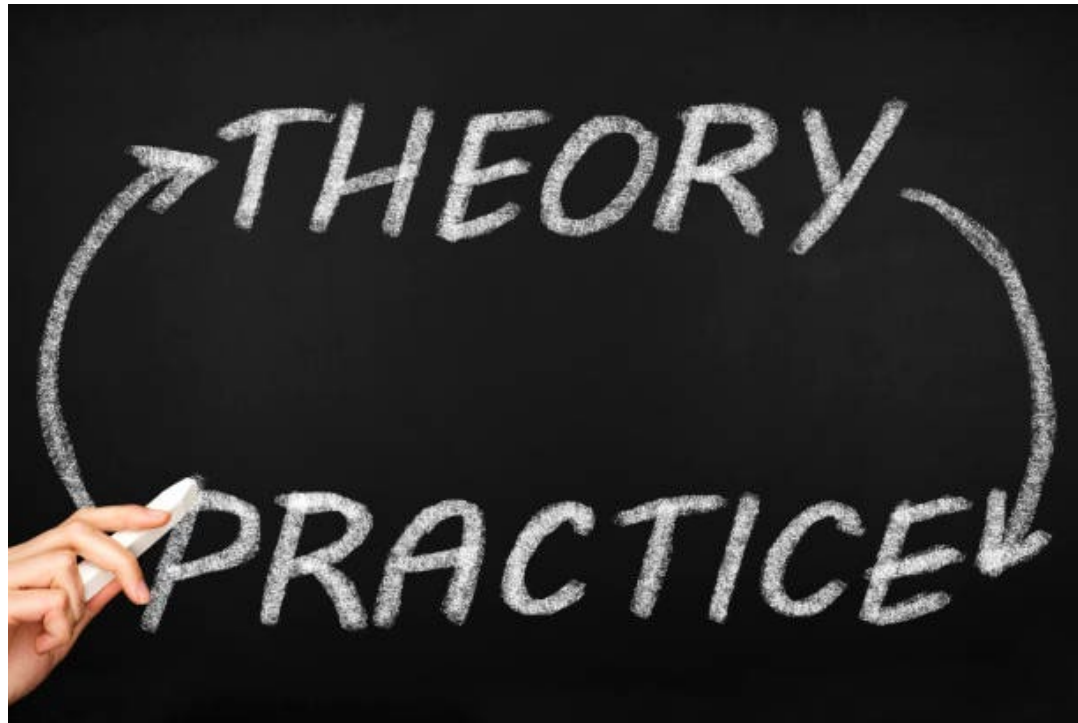

Learning Circle: Overview of the COMMA service

- Comma is service set up to prevent recurrent care proceedings by supporting women to place longer intervals between pregnancies. We offer therapeutic, holistic support to mothers who do not currently care for their children. These are bespoke offerings based on their individual needs. We can also support fathers who are in a relationship with the mother where required

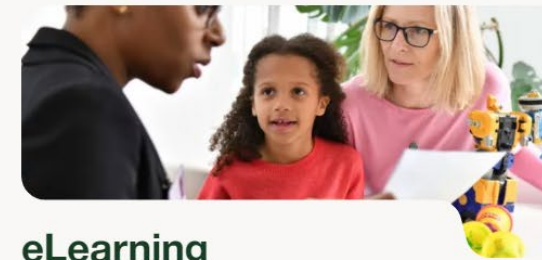
