Are You Recycling Right?

Brown Bin

Acceptable items: Aerosols, Glass bottles and jars (no lids), Food tins and drinks cans, Milk bottles, Foil and foil trays.

Unacceptable items: Plastic bottles – all types (no lids), Plastic bags.

Blue Bin

Acceptable items: Envelopes and mail, Magazines and catalogues, Newspapers, Cardboard cartons, Paper and shredded paper.

Unacceptable items: Plastic packaging.

Green Bin

For your food waste only use compostable liners with this logo.

Acceptable items: Dairy including egg shells, Rice, pasta and beans, Garden waste, Raw or cooked fruit and vegetables.

Unacceptable items: Teabags and coffee grounds, Raw or cooked meat and fish, including bones.

Black Bin

Acceptable items: Plastic pots, tubs and trays, Plastic Packaging, Plastic bags, Polystyrene, Plastic food trays.

Unacceptable items: Nappies and sanitary products, Bagged waste you can't recycle (try to flatten and squash to save space).

Stockport, such as...



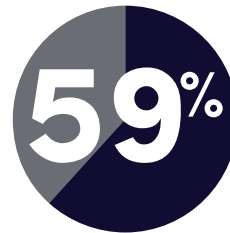
**Simply remove the bottle tops, empty and
