Dear Director of Children's Services,

Services available to Looked After Children placed in Stockport by another Local Authority

We are writing to tell you about the services and resources that Stockport Council and our partners are able to provide to Looked After Children who have been placed in Stockport by another Local Authority. This letter includes useful information about accessing local universal services as well as some information regarding more specialist services. Please share this information with the team/individuals that make placement decisions in your local area.

Consultation and notifications

In line with the 2021 amendments to the Care Planning, Placement and Case Review (England) Regulations, if you are planning to place a child or young person in Stockport from another Local Authority which is 'at a distance' you should consult with children's services in the area of placement. The regulation stipulates that every out of authority placement will require effective planning, engagement and information sharing with services likely to be responsible for meeting the child's needs. The following contact information should support you in making your decision to place.

Once a decision is made to place a child in Stockport, notification of the details should be uploaded to our secure webpages <u>http://www.stockport.gov.uk/childplacement which will allow you to notify us of a child placement, change of address or discharge.</u>

Stockport as a Location

Stockport is part of the conurbation of Greater Manchester (GM), situated approximately 8 miles south east of Manchester and on the edge of the Peak District National Park and Cheshire Plain. The M60 Manchester Orbital Motorway passes through Stockport close to the town centre at junctions 1 and 27 providing access to the Greater Manchester towns and authorities as well as the wider national motorway network. The A6 trunk road provides direct access to Manchester city centre to the north.

Rail services from Stockport take approximately 10 minutes to Manchester Piccadilly, 1 hour 30 minutes to Birmingham New Street and 2 hours to London Euston. Manchester International is the nearest airport, located approximately 7 miles to the south west.

Economic Context

Stockport is home to a highly skilled and productive labour force with almost a third of working age residents qualified to a degree level or equivalent, which has helped establish Stockport as a leading business location. Affluence is not spread evenly across the Borough, with significant pockets of deprivation in neighbourhoods including Brinnington, Lancashire Hill, Adswood, Bridgehall and the town centre. Stockport Missing From Home (MFH) Hub complete return to home interviews for ALL young people placed within the Stockport Borough apart for those placed by Manchester, Bury, Cheshire East/West and Tameside. These authorities commission an independent service to complete these return interviews.

Stockport MFH Hub also complete return interviews for Stockport children placed within the GM area. If the missing report is called to Stockport police the MFH hub will automatically be alerted to this episode via the Police OPUS system and the team will make contact with the carer to arrange an appointment to have a chat with young person when they have returned.
