# Mayoral Powers Look to Regenerate Stockport's Town Centre West

Greater Manchester leaders have given the go-ahead to consult on creating a <u>Mayoral</u> <u>Development Corporation</u> (MDC) to lead the regeneration of the Town Centre West area.

The ambition is for Town Centre West to become Greater Manchester's newest, greenest and coolest affordable urban neighbourhood that is ideally placed to meet the challenges and opportunities Town Centres face. As a walkable neighbourhood in the heart of Stockport, Town Centre West will provide a choice of homes and workspace where residents and business will have enviable access to public transport and be amongst the best connected in the region.

Stockport Council is encouraging businesses and residents to have their say on two proposals:

The existing walking and cycling strategies for Stockport were adopted in 2010 and 2000 respectively and therefore require revision to take account of changes which have been made to transport infrastructure in the Borough over that time. The new combined <u>Cycling and Walking Plan</u> sets out a long term vision for cycling and walking in Stockport.

The <u>Active Communities Strategy</u> aims to summarise findings about needs and priorities for health and wellbeing in relation to physical activity and our cultural offer; and to inform, the public about our prosposals for an Active Community.
