Lack of social distancing				Strict adherence to the most up to date government guidance: 2 meters where ever possible but where not one meters apart while taking mitigations to reduce the risk of transmission. Task leader to consider how many volunteers could participate and reduce numbers of volunteers if necessary. If working on a stretch of pathway to designate banksmen to ensure the distancing can be achieved from members of the public.
