# How to get the industrial look

## Step 1: Choose your colour

- Choose from our curated range of colours or LiveChat for free personalised colour advice.

## Step 2: Prep

- Clean your walls.
- If you have any cracks or holes, fill them with the appropriate filler.
- Sand them back, wipe them down and spot prime where needed.
- Mask around the edges.



## Step 3: Topcoat

- Stir Dulux Concrete Effect thoroughly prior to use.
- Work in small sections. Use a long nap roller to apply to the wall.
- Smooth the surface with a steel trowel with broad, sweeping strokes.
- Apply 3 coats using the same process. The final coat should dry for at least 2 hours, but no longer than 24 hours, before polishing. To polish, use 600 grit sandpaper in a circular motion.

TIP:

Apply enough pressure to keep the trowel edge flat against the surface. Be careful not to gouge the surface with the edge of the trowel.

### 1. PaintBack

### 2. Recycle your tin with waste paint hardener

#### Easy disposal of paint

Dulux EnviroSolutions Waste Paint Hardener is a great option. This handy product turns unwanted water-based paint back into solid waste for easy and safe household disposal in 3 steps:

#### Step 1

Simply scoop the desired amount of waste hardener into the paint tin and stir until paint solidifies.

#### Step 2

Leave for 2 hours with the lid off.

#### Step 3

Wrap hardened paint in newspaper and dispose of as hard waste. The clean, paint free tin can also be disposed of in recycled waste, providing a sustainable option to minimise the environmental impacts of paint products.



## Re-use accessories



Save your accessories for next time! Simply give them a good clean. If you've used water-based paint you can clean your brushes in a bucket of water to remove most of the paint, ready for use next time.

**Note:** for solvent-based paint, mineral turpentine is required.
