Complete your spray project with Duramax® Enamels in 4 steps.



STEP 1: PREP

- Use a drop sheet to protect surfaces from overspray.
- · Remove all dirt, grease and rust.
- · Ensure surface is dry.
- · Mask off any areas you don't want sprayed.



STEP 2: PRIME

- To increase durability and adhesion, prime with Duramax* Undercoat.
- Choose from Metal or Plastic primer, depending on your surface.



STEP 3: TOPCOAT

- Shake Duramax[®] Enamel Spray for three minutes before spraying.
- Hold can upright 15 to 25cm from the surface – test surface compatibility on an inconspicuous area.
- Spray with smooth, even strokes parallel to the surface.
- Apply with several light mist coats rather than one heavy coat.
- Allow to dry for two minutes between each coat. Leave for 24 hours before applying Duramax® Clear Coat.

NOTE: Shake all sprays prior to use. After use, prevent blocking by turning the can upside down and spraying until clear gas emerges. Ensure safety and application directions are followed as per product labels.

How-to make the most out of your paint and accessories

If you're completing your painting project over a few days:

To keep your paint fresh simply put the lid back on your tin and store in a cool, dry area.

To get the most out of your accessories including brush and roller, cover with foil or plastic wrap to avoid washing and wasting paint. **Note:** if using water based paint you can wash your accessories in a bucket with water. If solvent based, mineral turpentine is required.

If you've completed your painting project:

1. Take your paint tin with left over paint to your local Paintback collection site – there are over 160 nationally!

2. For easy disposal of water based paint, Dulux Envirosolutions Waste Paint Hardener is a great option. This handy product turns unwanted water based paint back into solid waste for easy and safe household disposal in 3 steps:



Step 1

Simply scoop the desired amount of waste hardener into the paint tin and stir until paint solidifies.

Step 2

Leave for 2 hours with the lid off.

Step 3

Wrap hardened paint in newspaper and dispose of as hard waste. The clean, paint free tin can also be disposed of in recycled waste, providing a sustainable option to minimise the environmental impacts of paint products.



3. Save your accessories for next time! Simply give them a good clean. If you've used water based paint you can clean your brushes in a bucket of water to remove most of the paint, ready for use next time.

Note: for solvent based paint, mineral turpentine is required.
