Response

The Gaming Machine (Circumstances of Use) Regulations 2007 require that gaming machines display the 'proportion of amounts paid to use the machine that is returned by way of prizes (*described as RTP; the average return to player*) or odds of winning prizes from use of the machine'. The Commission's Gaming Machine Technical Standards support this regulation by requiring that the "theoretical target percentage return to player must be clearly displayed to the player on the machine". For example, "THIS MACHINE HAS AN AVERAGE PERCENTAGE PAYOUT OF AT LEAST (VALUE) %".

RTP is described as an average measured over a large number of games and will vary over a typical session due to normal game volatility.

It is a matter for the manufacturer to decide upon the game RTP and there is no minimum requirement but the minimum average return must be displayed to the player for the game. The value displayed must be verified either by the manufacturer or accredited test lab for categories B2, B3, B3a and B1. The game on average must not return a value less than that displayed on the machine. We do not hold records of the variation of RTP over time for different games which will vary due to normal game volatility.
