Fines and Penalties	Fines and penalties  There have been 9 settlements in lieu of financial penalty made by industry during the year following agreement between the Commission and the operator to secure compliance with regulatory requirements, with the monies returned to identifiable victims, used for socially responsible purposes or cover the Commission's costs. Additionally, there were three financial penalties (paid for breach of anti-money laundering conditions and failure to keep consumers safe from gambling harms).

Casework	Casework The Commission imposed regulatory sanctions this year: <ul> <li>17 personal licences revoked,</li> <li>8 personal licensees received a warning</li> <li>4 operating licences revoked</li> <li>2 operators received warnings and financial penalties</li> </ul> <li>These actions against non-compliant businesses were to secure compliance with existing regulatory requirements.</li> <li>During this period 129 new operating licences were issued and 270 surrendered.</li>
Education, communications and promotion	<ul> <li>Education, communications and promotion The Commission has given: <ul> <li>Over 30 presentations to external stakeholders and over 40 to co-regulatory partners and exhibited at 10 trade fairs.</li> <li>General information was provided to operators and co regulatory partners via 9 Licensing Authority and 28 E bulletins and over 60 press releases during the year and we made various updates to our website content including advice notes, guidance notes, quick guides, mini blogs.</li> <li>Launched a new online application process for personal function licences</li> </ul> </li> <li>Publications <ul> <li>The Commission published:</li> <li>New national strategy to reduce gambling harm;</li> <li>Framework for measuring harms among children and young people;</li> <li>Various research documents on gambling behaviour and industry statistics;</li> <li>Enforcement report for 2017-18;</li> <li>Business plan for 2019-20 and an annual report and accounts for 2017-18.</li> <li>Guidance on complaints and disputes handling.</li> </ul> </li> <li>No activities listed in this section represent a change in the burden of regulation placed on business.</li> </ul>
