PROBLEM #1 A Mass Amount of Documents

We're talking about terabytes. 4.5 terabytes! Ricoh's in-house digital forensics lab collected 15.5 million documents of both physical paper and electronically stored information (ESI).

PROBLEM #2 Out of Time

With the close of document production less than one month away, the client had only 20 days to complete their review — but they lacked the internal resources to handle a review of that size.

ROUND #1 The Forensics Lab

The team in Ricoh's forensics lab jumped into action. After collecting the data using forensically sound methods, they started strategically running deeply advanced searches looking for patterns and utilizing cutting-edge technology to quickly identify and remove system files and duplicates, which decreased some of the bulk. These initial efforts reduced the data set of **15.5 million documents by over 50%.**

Expertly Applied Technology

Ricoh eDiscovery technology partners offer innovative software to cull down data sets for review. It is Ricoh's expertise of when and how to apply these technologies that creates the real value.

ROUND #2 The Project Managers

Ricoh's Project Managers were then engaged. Their expertise in advanced analytics, filtering techniques and systematic search term modification allowed them to further reduce the data set. These efforts **brought the count to 770,904**, which was then loaded

into the Relativity Assisted Review (RAR) platform — an industry-leading active learning technology that uses documents coded to determine whether other documents are likely responsive. RAR is a feature that uses a search function called "categorization" to help

the tool determine whether a document is likely responsive or not. Our reviewers, who are trained in advanced technology and analytics, use this function in their coding to further validate the documents.

ROUND #3 The Review Team

Finally the documents were batched for review in our secure Microsoft Azure hosted Relativity Platform. Using RAR, the collection of documents for attorney review was reduced again down to 330,116. The reviewers accessed the documents from a secured virtual portal

using multi-factor authentication and were able to complete the review one day ahead of the production deadline. These efforts resulted in reduction from **770,904 docs to 330,116 docs** — the final number of documents that were actually reviewed.

Using RAR on a project like this may result in additional dollars in cost savings (likely, thousands). Using RAR can drastically reduce review time and cost and actually increase the quality of work product.

Then, We Found Another Efficiency

Ricoh worked closely with the organization and ran RAR to identify the 500 most important documents from those remaining, providing yet another short cut. We reviewed this smaller subset for depo prep and inclusion in the primary evidentiary submission for the initial arbitration.

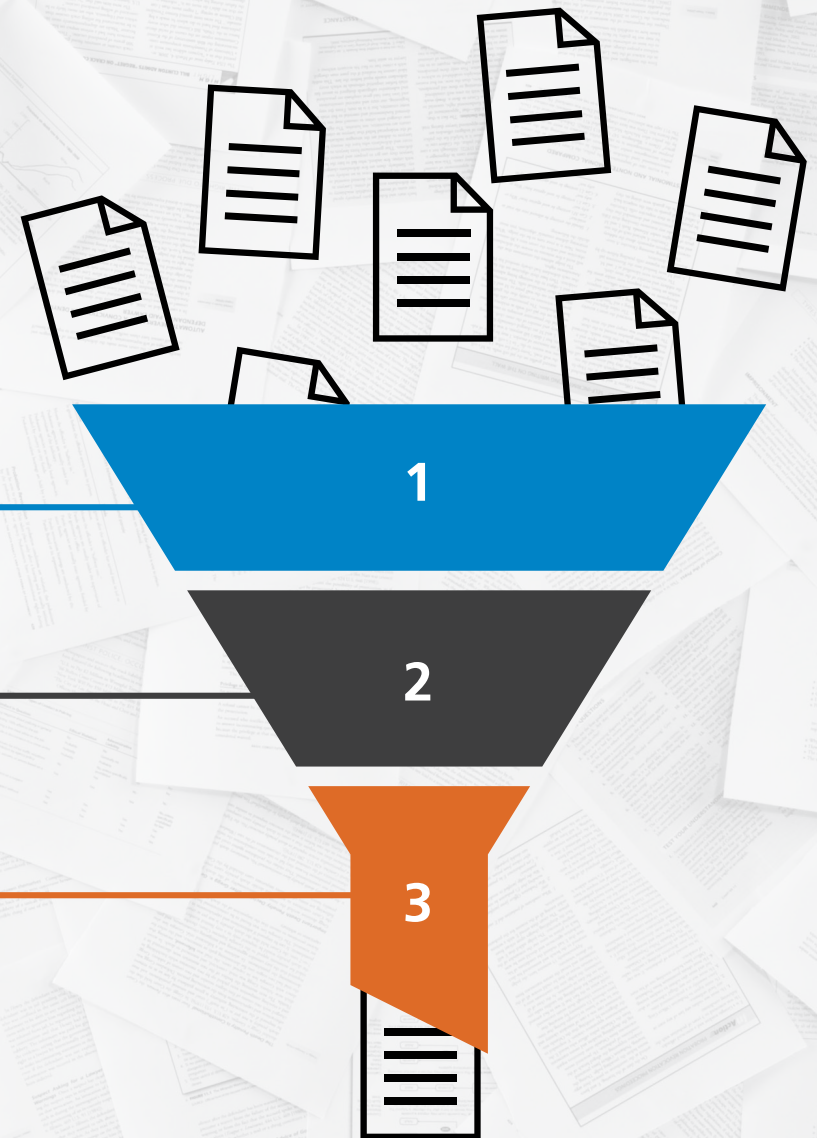
HOW MANY DOCS ARE WE TALKING ABOUT?
