Belus Rapidflash 35mm	<i>"Autofocus, autoflash, autofilm-load. I'd barely have to even point the thing."</i>	<i>"An upmarket beginner's tool, with automatic focus, flash, and film-load. A student's, perhaps - one with generous parents."</i>
Belus Trippy AF	<i>"A pocket snapper without the bells and whistles (and the hefty price-tag)."</i>	<i>"A compact pocket-camera with a Lucky Light lens and built-in flash. Mid-range. Could be anybody's."</i>
Paloma 35mm Compact	<i>"Looks the part but it's cheap. It's got a flash and ready-light, though. Comes with a case."</i>	<i>"A low-range option, with a flash and ready-light but not much else. Definitely a starter camera - maybe a beginner on a budget?"</i>
Sailor Bill 'My First Camera'	<i>"Not bad for a kids' cam. Sis's birthday is coming up - maybe I could save up for one."</i>	<i>"A kids' toy. You'd get kicked out of class if you whipped this out."</i>
Mikah 011 SBP Dual	<i>"Ah, a sammie-cam. Flat like a sandwich but crams normal and telefoto in, plus extended range."</i>	<i>"Small and low-end. Has normal and telefoto lenses for range, with some extension. Decent, but hard to imagine a student with that."</i>

Still a possibility.</i>
Belus FamCam 10B	<i>A pleasingly chunky little snapper. An all-rounder, with autofocus, built-in flash, and programmed shutter auto-exposure.</i>	<i>£99 with easy-use features and built to last. Targeted at parents for snaps of their kids' play and sports days, but not a bad choice for anyone.</i>
Dokad SwiftSnap	<i>Disposable. Just like any of the snaps you'd get with this toy.</i>	<i>Disposable, 27 shots. Definitely not it.</i>
Paloma Speedy 66 35mm	<i>Cheap but cheerful. It's got motor film advance and rewind - not many of those around at this price.</i>	<i>A decent lower-mid-range option The film's got motorised advance and rewind, and it's pretty compact. There's in-built flash, too. Could well be the student's.</i>
