

### How to claim

#### Before submitting a claim for WAC funding, you must:

- Check if WAC will best support your family financially. Read the WAC information and resources on the Defence Childcare Information Page on <u>defnet</u> or <u>Defence</u>
   <u>Connect</u> or search 'Wraparound Childcare' on the <u>Discover my Benefits</u> website.
- Complete the WAC registration in 'My child allowances' in the self-service section of JPA.



## Further information about your claim

- The majority of claims are automatically approved by JPA. Some personnel will require their claims to be manually approved by Unit HR. Claims will need to be submitted and approved before the payroll cut-off date for payment at the end of that month with salary.
- A TFC account must be in place for each child **before** the WAC registration can be completed. **A TFC account is not WAC registration.**
- Personnel must make sure they have enough money to pay their first WAC payment to their chosen provider without causing financial difficulty. The refunds will always be paid in arrears.
- The following must be kept as evidence for audit for 2 years from the claim:
  - Invoices (or equivalent)
  - Screenshot of proof of payment from the TFC account to the provider (this is only retained in the TFC account for 12 months, so will need to be kept separately in case of audit)
  - WAC eligibility confirmation email including WAC registration number(s) if registered from Autumn 2022 until 31 January 2024.

#### Find out how much you can claim

Use the <u>Discover My Benefits</u> WAC calculator to find out how much you could claim.\*

Add your invoice details to find out how much you could be eligible to claim. This will show a breakdown of the 80% paid by MOD and 20% top up from HMRC.

## Regional funding

The WAC funding is capped at regional hourly rates based on the average costs included in the <u>Coram Childcare Survey</u> (England, Scotland and Wales), <u>and the Northern Ireland Childcare Cost Survey.</u> The capped rates will be updated at the start of each academic year. This will affect WAC claims and SP should be aware that the amount that they can claim may go up or down at this point.

- Schools Includes registered wraparound childcare provided in a group setting by professionals who are
  not the child's parent or carer. For example, providers may be run by private companies, nurseries,
  schools, sports and youth clubs, or voluntary organisations such as charities.
- Childminders A childminder is a registered child carer who works with children for more than two hours a day in their own home. This maximum hourly rate also includes registered nannies. It excludes all types of informal childcare (e.g. grandparents, friends, babysitters).
