Intent

The intent and purpose of this visit is to look at the quality of provision and teaching; to think about 'what is it like for a child here'; and to ascertain how children are being supported in their learning and development. This is the second visit in the first year and the childminder will have already had a compliance visit to ensure they are meeting the Safeguarding and Welfare requirements of the EYFS.

Implementation

This visit will consist of discussion with the childminder and with parents where possible, observation of early years quality practice, evidence of reflective practice and scenarios.

Impact

All of the above are to ensure compliance, support for personal and professional growth and to enable reflective practice to enable progression of the childminder's business and to embed exceptional early years practice.

Grading

Quality of education - Good

Maryam has utilised her space incredibly well and created a warm safe nurturing environment which enhances children's learning and development. The children have some set routine times including school drop off and pick ups but there is also ample opportunity for both adult and child initiated activities. Maryam has all the areas of the EYFS covered and she communicates positively with the children at all times.

Good quality of teaching is carried out in this setting. Parents are informed regularly of the activities and experiences that children engage in both through the Tiney app and a whats App group. The setting is laid out in such a manner that all resources are accessible and chosen to develop the children's curiosity and stimulate and challenge them age appropriately. The transitions of children arriving and leaving at different times is well managed . The language used is rich and encourages all to support their learning. Children are offered a combination of adult and child initiated activities with focused activities daily. Each child has an individual scrap book of their art work and others are displayed around the room.

Maryam uses a now and next display along with each child putting their name up and she talks to them about emotions and deals with conflicts between the children appropriately. They love sitting at circle time to choose and read their books.

Personal development - Good

The children learn to understand and express their own needs. They confidently communicate when they want to go to the toilet or are hungry. They carry out acts of self care and help lay the table and clear away. All of Maryam's policies are updated yearly and her Covid policy is in line with government guidelines. All the children are encouraged to be independent and Maryam encouraged the children to cut their food and helped when needed. Maryam is able to talk confidently about the progress from their starting points each child has made. Maryam encourages regular handwashing and will reinstate teeth brushing in the new year.

Behaviour and attitudes – Good

All the children behave well at the setting and Maryam has stickers and is also introducing in the new year a teddy and book for the children to be able to take home when it is their turn and stick pictures of their adventures at the weekend with the teddy. Maryam regularly praises the children and acknowledges what they have done. All the children are eager to follow the routines of the setting from putting their name on the board to helping clear the meal time table. Maryam makes sure all the children feel valued and respected and confident that their needs are catered for.

Leadership and management - Good

Maryam is an experienced child care practitioner and very dedicated and passionate, Maryam has a very professional manner and she has very good professional relationships with parents and carers who have given lovely feedback and reviews. She has good communication and relationships with the teachers at the school she collects and picks up from and is sure to pass all required information to parents. All policies are updated yearly and parents receive copies of all documentation. Maryam is fully aware of the importance of her role as a childminder and understands her statutory responsibilities. She is fully aware of all requirements under the EYFS. All the children present have formed exemplary relationships with Maryam and they were all motivated in their free play activities and Maryam extended their learning with reading them a story and discussing their learning and play. Maryam has created friendships between the children and encouraged good relationships. Maryam has a robust settling-in policy which caters to each child's needs. The inviting atmosphere is clear from the minute the door is opened and it is clearly a home from home for the children. Maryam is aware of the needs of all the children and their families and makes sure the setting runs smoothly.

Overall effectiveness – What is it like for a child here?

Maryam uses rich vocabulary and corrects the children's language appropriately. The books and activities promote and reflect equality and diversity . The setting celebrates a range of festivals including black history month and Diwali. All the children's social skills are supported and they enjoy daily outside visits to the park and other places such as children's centres. Maryam herself models positive behaviour and has created an environment where the children feel totally safe and secure. The children display good manners and look out and help each other having formed close bonds.

Areas of strength

- Parents praise Maryam saying she provides fantastic care and her child has flourished with her.
- Maryam knows her children very well and is responsive to their needs
- The children are provided with healthy nutritious meals with a good variety of tastes.
- Maryam's knowledge of providing a variety of activities for the children to discover.

Areas for further professional development

- Further develop communication with parents so think of putting a white board at the front
- To further develop self reflection skills
- To streamline the recording of evidence related to the children and the progress they are making
- To enhance strategies to gain even more information from parents about what their children do at home, to support continuity and extend learning even further.

Safeguarding

• Maryam clearly understands the signs and symptoms which could cause her concern about a child in her care and the arrangements for safeguarding are effective. Maryam knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns.
