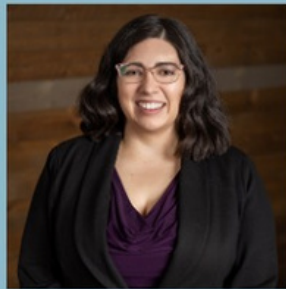

One Year in Our New Salesforce Org!

It's officially been one year since we migrated to our new Salesforce org! Much of the past year has been dedicated to rebuilding and improving functionality that existed in our previous org. At the same time, we've been able to introduce new enhancements and capabilities—and we still have a giant backlog of ideas and improvements to come! Want to see what's new? A list of recently deployed enhancements is available in Salesforce under **System Status & Enhancements**. With so much Salesforce development happening, we thought this anniversary was a good opportunity to give you a peek behind the curtain at what actually goes into an enhancement.

"It's Just One Field...Right?"

"A Look Behind the Scenes of Salesforce Enhancements"

"Can we just add a field for that?" It sounds simple—and sometimes it is! Creating a new field, checkbox, or button in Salesforce may only take a few minutes. But what you see on the screen is often just the tip of the iceberg. Behind that seemingly simple change may be a much larger network of automations, permissions, reports, integrations, validation rules, and business processes that also need to be considered. Imagine we add a checkbox to a Matter called **"Client Requires Follow-Up."** Creating the checkbox is the easy part. Before putting it into use, we need to ask:

- Who should be able to see and update it?
- Should checking it trigger a notification, task, or other automation?
- Does another field need to become required?
- Should it be included in reports?
- Does it affect related records or other processes?
- What should happen with existing Matters?
- What happens if someone checks it and later unchecks it?

Suddenly, we're no longer just adding a checkbox—we're potentially changing a business process.

Why Does IT Ask So Many Questions?

When you submit a Salesforce enhancement request, you may receive several follow-up questions

before development begins. We're not trying to make a simple request complicated; we're trying to identify the complications before we make the change. Salesforce is highly interconnected. Updating information on one record can trigger an automation that updates another record, which may trigger another process, send a notification, change what someone else sees, or affect a report.

Five minutes spent asking the right questions can prevent hours spent fixing the wrong solution.

This is also why testing is such an important part of the process. IT can confirm that an enhancement technically works, but the employees who perform the process every day can tell us whether it works the way the business actually needs it to work. Something can function exactly as it was designed and still not accomplish what we actually need. **Please keep the ideas coming!** Many of our best Salesforce improvements begin with someone identifying a repetitive task, an inefficient process, or simply asking: "Could Salesforce do this for us?" Just remember—the next time you ask us to **"just add a field,"** that little field might be sitting on top of a pretty big iceberg.



Counselor's Corner

Many homeowners feel trapped when a shoddy contractor records a lien on their home. Recently, one of Lindsay Obert's clients faced this situation: the work on his home wasn't complete, it was uninhabitable, and the contractor was threatening to foreclose on the lien. This situation can leave homeowners feeling that paying the "ransom" is their only option. But this homeowner wasn't ready to cave, and neither was Lindsay.

Attempts to negotiate a fair lien amount with the unreasonable contractor were futile. So, Lindsay prepped for court. She set out to prove that the contractor intentionally and knowingly recorded an excessive lien. At trial, Lindsay demonstrated that the contractor intentionally sought far more than they were entitled to collect. As a result, the contractor paid the price. By law, they had to pay our client's legal fees and costs and forfeit the lien. Way to go, Lindsay!

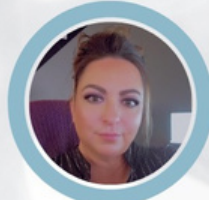

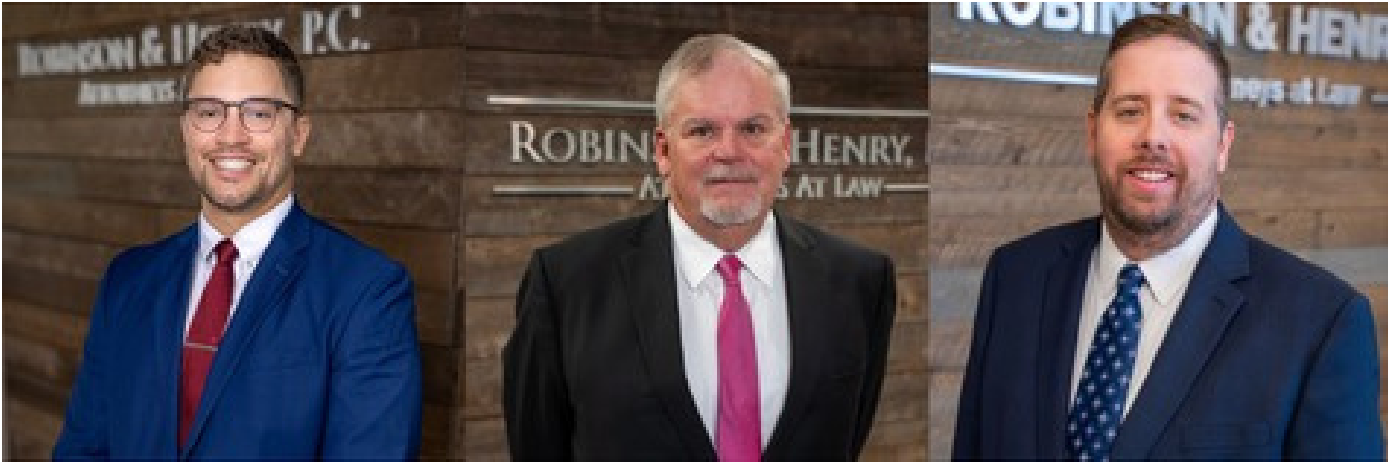
