



Camping - Frequently Asked Questions

McPHILLAMY PARK CAMPGROUND	
LOCATION	Top of the Mountain, near Skyline and the "Esses".
SIZE	8m x 8m (26 x 26 feet) *Approximate.
VEHICLE PASSES	2 per site
POWER	Not available
BEST FOR	Fans who want to immerse themselves in the mountain atmosphere with easy access to prime viewing points.
HEADS UP	• Mix of grass and dirt sites due to year-round vehicle access. • McPhillamy B is mostly flat but can be prone to flooding in heavy rain. • Sites to the left of 3rd Street (12th–23rd Avenue) slope downhill – not recommended for caravans.
PARKING	All vehicles, including motorbikes, must fit within your campsite boundary.
ACCESS	Enter via Gate 10, Barry Gurdon Drive with your valid 3-day general admission ticket and pre-mailed vehicle pass fixed to your windscreen.
FACILITIES	• Water: Potable water taps located throughout the campground. • Waste: Bin stations with recycling. Dump point near campground entrance. • Amenities: Permanent and temporary toilets/showers (including accessible). Closest blocks at: 7th & 8th Avenue intersection, 3rd Street near site 1094, near sites 378/379.

REID & SULMAN CAMPGROUND	
LOCATION	Top of the Mountain
SIZE	8m x 8m (26 x 26 feet) *Approximate
VEHICLE PASSES	2 per site
POWER	Not available
BEST FOR	Campers after a grassier, relaxed top-of-the-mountain spot with good proximity to facilities.
HEADS UP	• Mostly grass sites, though some are now dirt.

	Some uneven terrain – not all sites are caravan-friendly (non-suitable sites are flagged in the booking system).
PARKING	All vehicles, including motorbikes, must fit within your campsite boundary.
ACCESS	Enter via Gate 10, Barry Gurdon Drive with your valid 3-day general admission ticket and pre-mailed vehicle pass fixed to your windscreen.
FACILITIES	- Water: Potable water taps throughout the campground. - Waste: Bin stations with recycling. Dump point near campground exit towards McPhillamy Park. - Amenities: Mix of permanent and temporary toilets/showers (including accessible).

PADDOCK CAMPGROUND	
LOCATION	Inside the track, behind the pits.
SIZE	6m x 8m (19.5 x 26 feet) *Approximate
VEHICLE PASSES	1 per site (strictly enforced)
POWER	Not available
BEST FOR	Campers wanting to be close to the action with quick access to the paddock and pit areas.
IMPORTANT NOTES	- Mostly grass and van-friendly, but the smaller site size means large vans are unsuitable. - Some sites in Firth Avenue have uneven ground.
ACCESS TO THE EVENT	Wed–Thu (non-race track use): Gate 27 on Mountain Straight. Fri–Sun (track active): Gate 2 (behind Rydges) via tunnel – tunnel dimensions 3.5m wide x 3.1m high. Entry requires a valid 3-day general admission ticket and pre-mailed vehicle pass fixed to your windscreen.
FACILITIES	- Water: Potable water taps throughout campground (no direct water connections for vans). - Waste: Bin stations with recycling. Permanent dump point near amenities block. - Amenities: Mix of permanent and temporary toilets/showers (including accessible).

Q. How big are the campsites?

**Please note – Campground sites are all approximate. They are individually marked out each year by professional line markers. In some instances, campsites could be slightly smaller or larger and patrons are advised to work off having the smaller amount of area in each instance when making allowances prior to arrival at the event.*

Q. What time and where do I check in when I arrive at the campgrounds?

A. Check in for all campers opens from 9am Wednesday 11 February

Check in strictly closes at 10pm each night.

You must check in before entering the campgrounds between the below times. Unfortunately, check in is NOT available outside these times.

There will be 24 hour security at each gate if campers who have already checked in need to re-enter (i.e. they will be wearing wristbands and will just have their vehicle pass on display)

Please note:

Each person will require a valid admission ticket to gain entry to the campgrounds. At campground check-in, tickets must be shown to obtain a camping wristband.

At the event, tickets can only be purchased from the Ticket Booth at Harris Park, to avoid delays pre purchase your tickets online before arriving at the campground entries.

Q. When do I need to leave the campground after the Event?

A. Check out for Paddock campers wishing to depart via Mountain Straight is 9am Monday February 15.

Check out for all other campers departing via the tunnel OR on top of the mountain is strictly by 12 midday Monday February 15. This includes those who are using a third party (ie Camplify) to provide caravans.

Q. How many people are allowed in one campsite?

A. For your own comfort, we recommend a maximum of 8 people per campsite.

Q. Is there power available in the campgrounds?

A. There are no power provisions at the campgrounds. Generators are welcome however; we ask that you consider others patrons with the use of generators between 11pm and 7am.

Q. Can I bring alcohol into the campgrounds?

A. Yes, reasonable amounts of alcohol, as determined by the Promoter, are permitted to be brought into the campgrounds.

- Alcohol limits for the 2027 Bathurst 12 Hour campgrounds are as follows per person per day:
 - 1x carton of full-strength beer (5% alcohol or less) - 30 cans x 375mls or less, or
 - 1x carton of light / mid strength beer (3.5% alcohol or less) - 30 cans x 375mls or less, or
 - 1x carton of pre-mixed spirits (6% alcohol or less) – 24 cans x 375mls, or
 - 1x carton of cider (5% alcohol or less) – 24 cans x 375mls, or
 - 1x cask of sealed wine totaling 4 litres or less, or
 - 1x 750ml bottle of spirits (Plastic only), or
 - 2x 375ml plastic bottles of spirits (38 % alcohol or less) - must be the original manufacturer's product with seal unopened

PLEASE NOTE: You can only bring in One (1) day's alcohol supply at a time. There is no storage facility for excess alcohol and any alcohol over the daily limit will be confiscated and disposed of.

Q. Can I take alcohol from the campgrounds into the event precinct?

A. No, if entering a licensed area you cannot bring alcohol.

Q. Can I bring in my dog?

A. Animals will not be permitted into the campgrounds or circuit, unless the animal is a registered assistance dog (Please ensure you have all necessary documentation to show security). If patrons do attempt to bring animals into the Event venue, they will be asked to take the animal away.

Q. Am I allowed to have a camp fire?

A. Campers are permitted to have a camp fire on their campsite on the following conditions:

- A fire ban is not in place within Bathurst, NSW;
- The fire is contained within a metal barrel or drum;

If the Fire Danger Rating is classified as Extreme or Catastrophic, NSW Rural Fire Service are at liberty to request all lighting of fires be suspended and all burning fires to be extinguished.

Firewood can be obtained by the official firewood supplier who will be selling firewood around the mountain the entire time the campgrounds are open. No wood with nails will be permitted into any campgrounds (no broken pallets).

Q. How much fuel can I take for my generator?

A. A 20L drum of fuel for your personal generator is the maximum amount permitted to enter the event precinct per day.

What are the prohibited items?

A. The prohibited items are not limited to the below list. However security and the event organiser can deem an item or activity prohibited at their discretion:

- NO illegal substances, fireworks, explosives or weapons of any nature
- NO couches or lounge chairs
- NO animals (excluding working Guide Dogs or Registered Assistance Animals)
- NO platforms, structures or materials to be used to erect platforms or other viewing platforms
- NO items that the Promoter reasonably considers will obstruct the view or jeopardise the safety, comfort or experience of other patrons
- NO power tools, chainsaws, or dangerous equipment
- NO unregistered motorised wheeled devices
- NO glass bottles or other glass items
- NO items the promoter reasonably considers not appropriate to be taken into the campgrounds

Q. What is the height of the access tunnel into the Pit Paddock?

A: 3.1m high.

Q. If I can no longer attend can I get a refund?

A. Refunds are only permitted to the extent that the Event Organiser is required to provide a refund by law.

Bathurst 12 Hour Campgrounds Conditions of Sale and Entry

The following conditions (**Campground Conditions**) apply to all persons entering any campground located within the precinct of the Event (**Campgrounds**), the supply of any ticket, pass, credential or other entry authorisation providing admission to any part of the Campgrounds (**Ticket**). Any person purchasing a Ticket, using a Ticket to access the Campgrounds, or otherwise accessing the Campgrounds (**you**) agrees to be bound by the Campground Conditions. In these Campground Conditions, Supercars means V8 Supercar Television Pty Ltd and its related body corporate (**Supercars**) and Event means the Bathurst 12 Hour event conducted by Supercars (**Event**).

Tickets

1. Your Ticket is issued to you personally and cannot be resold, loaned, transferred, assigned or licensed to any other person without authorisation by Supercars. Supercars may cancel any Ticket without refund to you which is dealt with in a way that breaches this clause 1.
2. Your Ticket provides you with a conditional licence to enter the Campground stated on your Ticket for a limited period of time. You must not enter or remain at that Campground outside of those times.
3. Your Ticket does not provide you with access to the Event. Your entry to the Event is subject to you holding a separate valid ticket, pass, credential or other entry authorisation providing admission to the Event, as well as complying with any conditions of entry applicable to the Event.
4. You may be refused entry to, or directed to leave, the Campgrounds if you fail to present your Ticket upon request by Supercars and/or Event staff.
5. Supercars reserves the right to limit the number of Tickets you can purchase. Supercars may, in its absolute discretion, cancel any Tickets purchased by you if it determines you have purchased an amount of Tickets exceeding the stated Ticket limit.
6. Tickets remain the property of Supercars at all time.

Campsites

7. You must not camp, place and/or leave property (**Camp**) at any campsite other than the campsite specified on your Ticket (**Campsite**).
8. The maximum number of people permitted to Camp on your Campsite is eight (8).
9. You must not enter any other campsite in the Campgrounds unless authorised by ticketholders of that campsite.
10. Supercars reserves the right to relocate or alter the dimensions or shape of your Campsite due to operational and/or safety issues including but not limited to extreme weather events, fire or natural disasters. If Supercars relocates your Campsite, or alters your campsite in a material way, Supercars will, where possible, offer you an alternative Campsite for the period of the booking at no additional cost to you. Supercars will refund the fees for all the unused portion of your booking if you decline such an offer, or if Supercars is unable to offer an alternative Campsite. Supercars will not be liable for any other losses incurred by you as a result of the relocation or alteration, including the cost of any travel or accommodation expenses.

Refunds and event cancellation

11. Supercars will only provide you with a refund for Tickets purchased by you if:
 - (a) the Event is cancelled, rescheduled or materially relocated;

- (b) as otherwise required by law (including the Australian Consumer Law); or
 - (c) if in Supercars' absolute discretion, it determines to give you a refund due to exceptional circumstances beyond your control (***Exceptional Circumstances Refund***).
12. Applications for refunds for Exceptional Circumstances Refunds must be submitted in writing to camping@supercars.com.
13. For the avoidance of doubt, Supercars will not offer you a refund for a change of mind by you.
14. If the Event is cancelled or rescheduled, or if Supercars is otherwise required by law to issue you a refund, to the extent permitted by law, Supercars liability to you will be limited to the amount for which you paid for any Ticket.

Conduct

15. You must abide by the directions of Supercars and/or Event staff, police, Event security or any person appointed as an authorised person under any relevant legislation or instrument whilst in the Campgrounds.
16. Unless expressly authorised by Supercars, You must not:
- (a) do anything or conduct yourself in a way which, or which has the potential to;
 - i. unreasonably interfere with the security or comfort of other Campgrounds attendees or obstruct any Supercars staff, Event staff, police and/or Event security;
 - ii. adversely affect the safety of Campground attendees, Supercars staff and/or Event staff; or
 - (b) damage or deface any part of the Campgrounds or any other person's property;
 - (c) use racist, indecent or obscene language or threatening or insulting words or otherwise behave in a threatening, abusive, riotous, indecent or insulting manner;
 - (d) become intoxicated, use banned drugs or supply alcohol to minors
 - (e) enter any restricted area;
 - (f) carry out any commercial or political activity within the Campgrounds, including offering goods or services for sale;
 - (g) conduct surveys or opinion polls;
 - (h) litter;
 - (i) engage in any criminal activity;
 - (j) use any items or materials to cordon off or "reserve" any space within the Campgrounds outside of your Campsite;
 - (k) use any items or materials to cordon off any part of the perimeter of your Campsite which exceed 1.2 meters in height;
 - (l) erect any flagpole, structure or other item which exceeds 4 meters in height; or
 - (m) ignite any flare, firework, explosive or smoke bomb;
 - (n) ignite or have any fire burning on the Campgrounds, unless:
 - i. the fire is contained within a metal barrel, drum or equivalent vessel on your Campsite; and

- ii. the fire rating for the Central Ranges region is not classified as Extreme or Catastrophic (as determined by the NSW Rural Fire Service) at the time of ignition and burning.
- 17. You must ensure no noise is emitted from your Campsite which is audible from the next closest campsite between 11pm and 6am. Noise levels emitted from Campsites must be kept to a reasonable level at all other times.
- 18. Gazebos and associated line markings can only be erected/marked within the Event Precinct from when camping opens (9am February 11). Any gazebos or markings within the Event Precinct prior to this time will be removed. Please observe the line markings noting the space left for pedestrian access in locations.
- 19. Supercars reserves the right to refuse you entry to, or remove you from the Campgrounds, cancel or confiscate your Ticket or take any other action which Supercars considers appropriate if:
 - (a) you are in breach of these Campground Conditions;
 - (b) you are in breach of any applicable law, regulation and/or government regulation;
 - (c) Supercars receives a direction to do so from law enforcement agencies; or
 - (d) Supercars reasonably believes that your conduct negatively impacts, or has the potential to negatively impact the safety, security or comfort of other Campgrounds attendees, Supercars and/or Event staff, or the integrity of Supercars or motorsport in general.
- 20. You acknowledge that you are responsible for the safety and security of your own personal property and hereby release Supercars from any liability for loss or damage (including any direct, indirect or consequential loss or damage) to any personal property brought into any area of the Campgrounds.

Campground Roads

- 21. All roads within the Campgrounds are public roads subject to NSW laws, including the *Road Transport Act 2013* (NSW) and any applicable rules made under that Act or any act which supersedes that Act (**Road Rules**). You must comply with all Road Rules whilst using Campground roads.
- 22. You must not bring any Vehicle (as defined in the *Road Rules 2014* (NSW)) onto the Campgrounds which:
 - (a) is not registered; or
 - (b) does not display a Ticket allowing that vehicle to enter the Campgrounds.
- 23. Supercars may refuse entry to, or direct you to remove, any Vehicle brought onto the Campgrounds by you or situated in your campsite which breaches either of clauses 22 or 22.

Alcohol and Prohibited Items

- 24. You acknowledge that Supercars imposes maximum quantities of alcohol which you can bring onto the Campgrounds and be in possession of on the Campgrounds on each day of the Event (**Maximum Alcohol Quantities**). You must not have in your possession on the Campgrounds or bring onto the Campgrounds any alcohol in excess of the Maximum Alcohol Quantities. The latest Maximum Alcohol Quantities are available at www.bathurst12hour.com.
- 25. Unless expressly authorised by Supercars, you must not have in your possession on the Campgrounds, or bring onto the Campgrounds any of the following items:

- (a) chairs, lounges, benches or stools, other than a folding chair or folding stool (unless such items remain within your vehicle);
 - (b) clothing bearing any racist language or images;
 - (c) any power tool (other than battery-powered hand drills);
 - (d) glass (other than glass jars 200ml or under in size containing food preserves or other spreads);
 - (e) gas bottles heavier than 9 kilograms (inclusive of the gas);
 - (f) fuel in excess of 20 litres;
 - (g) flares or fireworks;
 - (h) prohibited or controlled weapons or firearms;
 - (i) firewood containing any nails, bolts or screws;
 - (j) drones and other unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV);
 - (k) automated or motorised personal transportation devices, including but not limited to e-bikes, Segways, hoverboards, or any battery-powered transportation device, whether or not the device is a registered vehicle;
 - (l) animals other than animals recognised as assistance animals under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (Cth) (Supercars, acting reasonably, may request evidence that an animal is an assistance animal and/or is trained to meet standards of hygiene and behaviour that are appropriate for an animal in a public place); or
 - (m) any other item which Supercars reasonably believes could negatively impact, or have the potential to negatively impact the safety, security or comfort of Supercars staff or other patrons within the Campgrounds or which are prohibited under applicable legislation.
26. Supercars reserves the right to confiscate any alcohol in excess of the Maximum Alcohol Quantities or any item listed in clause 25 found on the Campgrounds. Supercars will not be liable to return to you, or compensate you whatsoever for, anything confiscated under this clause 26.

Liability

27. Subject to clause 28 of these Campground Conditions:
- (a) you release and indemnify Supercars against any loss, liability, damage, cost or expense whatsoever and howsoever arising (whether direct or indirect) resulting from, or in connection with, any claim threatened or made, or action brought against Supercars in respect of, or in connection with, your attendance at the Campgrounds; and
 - (b) to the extent permitted by law, no condition, warranty, right or liability whether express or implied applies to these Campground Conditions, other than those conditions, warranties, rights and liabilities expressly set out in these Campground Conditions
- (together, the **Modification of Rights**).
28. No Modification of Right will operate to the extent such modification would exclude, restrict or modify any condition, warranty, right or liability, including any liability under the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Cth) (the **ACL**), in a manner which would render these Campground Conditions or any provision of these Campground Conditions void, illegal or unenforceable.

29. To the extent permitted by law, the total liability of Supercars to you in relation to a breach of a statutory guarantee under the ACL will be limited in the manner set out in sections 64A(1) and 64A(2) of the ACL.

Privacy

30. By purchasing a Ticket, you consent to Supercars collecting, using and storing your personal information in accordance with Supercars' Privacy Policy (www.supercars.com/privacy-policy) for the following purposes:
- (a) providing you with a Ticket;
 - (b) allowing Supercars to operate the Event; and
 - (c) helping Supercars promote the Event and subsequent similar events.
31. Supercars' Privacy Policy contains information about how you may access and seek correction of your personal information, how you can complain about a breach of your privacy rights, and how a complaint will be dealt with.

General

32. Supercars may alter these Campground Conditions if such changes are reasonably necessary to address safety issues or otherwise protect the legitimate interests of Supercars. Copies of the latest Campground Conditions will be available at www.supercars.com and at the Campgrounds.
33. The invalidity or illegality of a provision or any part of a provision in these Campground Conditions shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of, or the valid and legal remainder of such provision of, these Campground Conditions.
34. Information published by Supercars on www.bathurst12hour.com.au regarding Campsite booking, Ticketing and the Campgrounds in general forms part of these Campground Conditions (**Campground Information**). In the event of any inconsistency between these Campground Conditions and Campground Information, these Campground Conditions will prevail to the extent of that inconsistency.
35. These Campground Conditions are governed by the laws applicable in the State of New South Wales and both you and Supercars submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of that state.
