

There is no parking or drop-off zones available as roads will be closed around the area.

Other Accessibility Information

Sydney Lunar Streets is an accessible and inclusive event. The following provides information on accessibility and things to note so you can be fully prepared and know what to expect.







Things to note

- Lunar Streets can be very crowded so movement may be slower.
- Lunar Streets can be very loud with crowds, performances and DJs. If sensitive to noise, it's recommended that you bring your own noise cancelling headphones.
- As roads are closed, there is no accessible drop-off or pickup nearby. It's recommended that public transport is used.
