The themed gowns also lead to interactive experiences that aid emotional wellbeing, like playing games through our unique gown QR code or bonding with medical staff about the characters on their gown. Starlight Hospital Gowns are specially designed with ties down the side for better privacy and have snaps on the sleeves to allow easier access for hospital staff during medical procedures.

In 2022, over 118,000 Hospital Gowns were delivered to hospitalized children at the 500+ hospitals that we partner with across the U.S.
