Guidelines to Operational Stakeholders (1/2)



The "right timing"

It appears **essential to submit the "right project in the right call"**. The notion of "readiness for implementation" as well as the Gantt charts are there to determine your best timing. It is recommended to **focus the next investments to High Readiness Families and in synchronization with the Gantt charts**

Target the "Network Relevant" Gaps



Network-critical gaps have been identified in cooperation with the NM. It is recommended to focus on initiatives crucial to resolve or mitigate the impacts of current performance (mainly capacity and flight efficiency) constraints and bottlenecks, which might hinder the overall performance at network level

Guidelines to Operational Stakeholders (2/2)

De-fragmenting implementation

SDM recommends the systematic partnering of the stakeholders involved together in closing the same gap and SDM stands ready to act as a facilitator to ease such regrouping. In this respect, when deemed beneficial for the overall objectives of the initiatives and for the achievement of the associated performance benefits, it is recommended to evaluate the opportunity of liaising between different stakeholders [...] in order for them to present joint proposals in the framework of upcoming Calls



Civil/military coordination



It is [...] recommended to civil and military stakeholders to enhance the cooperation processes, particular when the DP 2016 identifies that military stakeholders are required to close a gap where civil stakeholders are involved

Financing instruments for Connecting Europe Facility 2014-2020

Under the **Connecting Europe Facility (CEF)**, \in 22.4 billion* will be made available from the EU's 2014-2020 budget to co-fund transport infrastructure projects in the EU Member States. Within this overall amount, \in 11.305 billion will be available only for projects in Member States eligible for the **Cohesion Fund**.

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Financing instruments for Connecting Europe Facility 2014-2020 Zoom on cohesion envelope

The CEF Transport Programme has significantly increased focus on Cohesion countries which received through the 2014 and 2015 CEF Transport Cohesion calls a total of 10.2 billion in EU funding.

All cohesion countries, aside from Cyprus, have consumed more than 70% of their national envelopes under the cohesion calls.



Cohesion Countries with available budget:

 Slovenia (99,8 % - 159/159 million), Lithuania (98,4 % - 364/358 million), Poland (92,9 % - 4,14/3,830 million), Portugal (82,5 % - 509/420 million), Croatia (76,7 % - 454/349 million), Czech Republic (75,6 % - 1,113/842 million), Slovakia (75,5 % - 740/559 million), Bulgaria (72,6 % - 405/294 million), Cyrus (1,6 % - 48/0,7 million)

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Funding objective 3 "Single European Sky – SESAR"

The objective is to **support the timely and efficient deployment of SESAR through improvement of the performance of ATM in Europe** by modernising and harmonising ATM systems, synchronising the deployment of essential ATM functionalities, enhancing civilmilitary interoperability, reducing fragmentation and consolidating the provision of air navigation services.

1. Common Projects

 Civil and military Implementation Projects deploying ATM functionalities identified in Common Projects (EC Reg No 716/2014), in accordance with the Deployment Programme.

Deployment Manager is to act as coordinator in each of these projects

2. Other Projects

- Projects not included in Common Projects and not falling under the competence of the Deployment Manager that contribute to the implementation of the SES by promoting the optimal provision of air navigation services and seamless functioning of the European ATM system.
- To optimise the impact of Union funding on the implementation of the Deployment Programme, the Commission may focus the scope of the 2016 call for proposals on specific ATM functionalities or parts of them.
- Indicatively, 80% of the available funding under Priority "Single European Sky - SESAR" will be dedicated to projects selected under Category 1

SESAR Deployment 3-level governance

- With the IR N.409/2013 a new governance has been established for the SESAR Deployment
- On 5th of December 2014 the SESAR Deployment Alliance has been appointed as the SESAR Deployment Manager (SDM) by the European Commission (EC) to synchronize and coordinate the modernization of Europe's air traffic management system, under the political oversight of the European Commission.



2016 CEF Transport Calls from proposals to co-funded projects: Process Overview

Participation to CEF Transport calls through SDM coordination is mandatory for any candidate project which is PCP related in order to **comply with CEF eligibility criteria** and to ensure **full alignment with DP.**

- ✓ SDM acts as "<u>coordinator</u>" (*) of all Implementing Partners' responses to the CEF Transport Call for Proposals
- SDM will oversee processes to be followed by the Implementing Partners in order to comply with its role as "gateway" to INEA to accomplish requests and agreed deadline, facilitating the access to EC Funds.

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From Implementation Projects description to Action proposal(s)



The **IP Description** reports the information about the **candidate project** in terms of:

- Technical Aspects: technical description
- Economics: economic and financial aspects of the project
- Performance: expected performance of the project
- Other impact: such as social and economic impact, public consultation, buildings permit, etc.

Application Forms

According to the EC/INEA process for proposal elaboration, the Action proposal consists of four Application forms:

- PART A Main characteristics of the proposal and budget of the Action
- PART B Administrative Information on Applicants (e.g. Legal Entity Form, Requirements on Financial and Operational Capacity, etc.)
- PART C Compliance with Union Policy and Law
- PART D Technical Information (such as General description of the global project, description of the proposed Action, Maturity, Impact and Quality of the Proposed Action.



Focus on implementing partners/SDM roles and responsibilities

IPPs role

- To provide timely the information about the candidate project(s) through the IP description template(s)
- To provide all supporting documents, administrative and legal (Financial Identification From, Legal Entity Form, etc.)
- To cooperate in the elaboratation of technical and financial parts of the proposals through an interactive process
- To interact with the related Member State / NSA to ease the process of proposals endorsement

SDM role

- ✓ To assist the IPPs in the elaboration of the proposal(s) in response to PCP related Calls (cat 1. Common Projects)
- ✓ To ensure the compliance with: CEF Workprogramme and call text, in particular with reference to the DP, deadline, eligibility and evaluation criteria
- ✓ To ease the proposals elaboration, SDM put in place a several facilities
 - Guidelines for proposals elaboration
 - Videos
 - Dedicated email addresses
 - Periodic Questions&Answers
 - **Repository**
 - SDM website

The **48 families** of the DP 2016 illustrate **all implementation initiatives needed towards full PCP deployment**. In order to submit proposals, Implementing Partners shall specifically consider:

Readiness for implementation and IOC/FOC dates

Description and scope of the Family

List of stakeholder considered as gaps, thus eligible for funding under the PCP regulatory framework

ATM MP references, SESAR solutions and VLDs, Guidance Material, Regulations, etc., to be consulted in order to prepare a fully compliant proposal

Specific **Recommendation for IP proposals**, prepared by SDM and aiming at guiding stakeholders wiling to launch initiatives linked to a Family

Deployment Approach, which briefly illustrates the suggested approach to deploy the Family, identifying key milestones to be achieved during the implementation

The "Gaps" notion and the detailed view per Stakeholder

When preparing a Call for Proposal, Operational Stakeholders shall take into account the <u>list of</u> <u>gaps</u> included in the Project View WBS and the related detailed <u>view per stakeholder</u> included in the Monitoring View. For the first time, the DP 2016 lists **both** <u>what's left to be implemented</u> (the Family), where <u>(the identified gaps in the WBS)</u> and which stakeholders are <u>called to</u> <u>participate to the implementation</u> (provided in the monitoring View)

Legal setup of the SESAR Deployment Framework Partnership 1/5

Since the Management and Implementation levels of the SESAR deployment governance have to be composed either of legal entities representing individuals or groupings of operational stakeholders, including in some cases those from non-EU Member States, each entity must commit to fulfil the obligations defined in Articles 9 and 10 of the Implementing (EU) No Regulation 409/2013, depending on the role to be played within these levels.

To do so a structured legal framework has been defined, and it is composed of 3 main Agreements

Framework Partnership Agreement (FPA)

Framework Partnership Agreement is the long-term **cooperation mechanism to establish the management and implementation levels** of the SESAR deployment governance (relations between 3 layer governance).



- The FPA has been signed on 5th of December 2014 by SDM Managing Director (on behalf of 16 Implementing Partners) and European Commission.
- The FPA is amended according to:
 - results of CEF Transport call new Implementing Partners are awarded with PCP related CEF Grant for the first time;
 - A yearly version of the new DP
- The Agreement is structured as follows:
 - Action Plan
 - ✓ General Conditions
 - Models (Technical, Economical and Financial, and Mandates for the FPA and SGA signature)

Legal setup of the SESAR Deployment Framework Partnership 4/5

Internal Cooperation Agreement (ICA)

Internal Cooperation Agreement governs relationship amongst the Coordinating and Implementing Partners regarding their operation, including all internal aspects related to the coordination of the partners and the implementation of the Action(s). The Agreement, which entered into a force on 31st of May 2015, is structured as follows:



A. SESAR Deployment Manager structure & operation:
 1. SESAR Deployment Manager tasks and obligations
 2. SESAR Deployment Manager governance

• B. Working arrangements with Implementing Partners

- 1. Realisation of the Deployment Programme
- 2. Implementation Project funding through Specific Grant Agreements (SGA)
- 3. Mandate to the SESAR Deployment Manager
- 4. No financial responsibility of the SESAR Deployment Manager
- 5. Action Coordinator; financial payments
- 6. .
- C. General Provisions
 - 1. Term and Termination:
 - a. General
 - b. Cancellation of funding for the SDM
 - c. Continuity of work

Legal setup of the SESAR Deployment Framework Partnership 5/5

Specific Grant Agreement (SGA)

Specific Grant Agreement governs the award of European Union grants to the Implementing Partners and is signed by the SDM Managing Director (on behalf of the partners) and the European Commission.



By the SGA signature the Implementing Partners accept the grant and agree to implement the Action in accordance with the terms and conditions of the SGA.

The SGA besides the main Agreement, includes also the following Annexes:

Annex I Description of the Action (including IP templates dully filled in) - this section provides a detailed description of the activities to be carried out during the lifespan of the Action.

 Annex II - Budget provides an overview of the budget of the Action per partner and per activity.

Both Annexes are elaborated by SDM on the basis of the Implementing Partners inputs.
