Withdrawal Management (Detox)

We are open every day, 24 hours a day.

When you are ready to start your recovery journey, we are here for you.

Detox from drugs or alcohol can be uncomfortable, but medication and medical care make symptoms more tolerable, keep you safe, and help you successfully move forward with treatment. The ADM Crisis Center includes a 28 bed, inpatient unit with medical and administrative staff and substance use treatment and mental health counselors. During your stay, you will receive a medical assessment and a substance use assessment, along with 24-hour care and medication management. Individual counseling, group counseling, and 12-step meetings are available on site to help you. Staff will assist with referrals to appropriate treatment providers and other needed services in the community, so when you are discharged you have resources and next steps in place.

What To Expect

- You can expect to be at the ADM Crisis Center for 4-6 days; however the stay is based on medical necessity.
- You may wear your own appropriate clothing and should bring clothing for three days. Basic toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo and shower shoes) are provided or you can bring them. All property must fit in an under-the-bed storage bin.
- You may smoke unopened store bought cigarettes during designated smoke breaks. Opened cigarette packages, cigars and/or vaping devices will be secured and returned at discharge.
- You will need to complete a consent form in order for staff to discuss your progress with your designated support person and/or accept any drop-offs.
- You may request one drop-off per day. Staff will make the drop-off request call. Approved items may be dropped off between 7:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.
- Cell phones and use of staff phones are not allowed during your stay. We want you to focus on your recovery. Approved phone calls will be made with a counselor.
- Prior to discharge, your support person will be invited to attend a planning session to learn how they can be an effective part of your recovery process.
- If you are not a Summit County resident you must be enrolled in Medicaid in order to receive services.
