The Barack Obama Foundation is seeking proposals from a vendor that specializes in Snow Removal for the Obama Presidential Center (OPC) campus. More information will be provided upon execution of a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA).

What is the mission of the Obama Foundation?

The Foundation's mission is to inspire, empower, and connect people to change their world. That mission begins at home, on the South Side of Chicago, where the Foundation is building the Obama Presidential Center in the heart of historic Jackson Park. In addition to building the Obama Presidential Center, the Foundation currently has active programs all over the city of Chicago, country, and the world.

The Barack Obama Foundation is a nonprofit tax-exempt organization under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

What will the scope include?

The selected vendor will support the Obama Foundation's in-house teams by providing snow and ice removal services across the 19.3-acre Obama Presidential Center campus in Jackson Park. Work will include clearing designated roads, paths, and service areas during events of 1.5 inches or more, hauling excess snow, and applying LEED- and SITES-compliant de-icing materials. Services must meet APPA Level 1 cleanliness, prioritize sustainability and safety, and include 24/7 readiness with real-time coordination.

- Be a professional and committed partner to the Foundation
- Offer inclusive and local representation within a team that has expertise in the nonprofit sector and cultural institutions
- Satisfy prescribed budget and schedule requirements
