Your Initial Medicare Enrollment Checklist is Here



Enrolling in Medicare can seem scary, but it doesn't have to be. We've put together this checklist to help you prepare for this important milestone.

When to Sign Up for Medicare

There's a special time to sign up for Medicare called your Initial Enrollment Period (IEP). It's a **7-month window around your 65th birthday**:



TIP: Be sure to sign up during your IEP to avoid any issues or penalties!
