Lesson 86 · Counting 70-100

Learning objectives

Children will:

- identify the numbers 70–100.
- order the numbers from 70–100.
- work fluently with equations up to 10.

Extra assistance

To reinforce the numbers 1 to 100 and counting skills in this range, play lots of games and activities involving counting. Skipping and racing can involve counting steps. Count how long it takes to do something like putting notes in their bags or getting a drink (a minute or two maximum). Count the letters in a sentence or words on a page.

Classroom activities

Larger or Smaller?


Give each student a number 71–100 on a card. Keep it secret! Ask students to pair up with someone and compare numbers silently. The student with the smaller number must sit down. The students left standing pair up again and again, until the student with the highest number is left standing. Play again, this time looking for the smallest numbers.

Order, Order!


Give individual students a set of cards for the tens 10, 20, 30, 40 and so on to 100. Ask them to lay the cards out in correct order and count them out loud. Next they are going to race to put them in reverse order, 100 to 10. Say 'ready, set, go!' Praise the fastest. Count the tens out loud backwards. Repeat until they are fluently ordering and counting backward as well as forward.


