3.	CADP update	
3.1	GW set out the key work to date for CADP. The project has installed around 600 piles and the deck beams for the eastern terminal extension have began. The temporary immigration facility (TIF) will be ready to operate at the end of December. The Digital Air Traffic Control Tower (DATCT) construction and fit out are largely complete and testing is expected to commence by the end of July.	
3.2	<ul> <li>GW set out the Airport's proposal to resequence the construction work. This is summarised as follows:</li> <li>Remains a single phase build but requires more time than originally planned. Delays have come from extended period of UXO clearance and piling construction;</li> <li>A change in the construction sequence will allow us to be able to serve passenger demand and build the airport at the same time;</li> <li>The principal is to keep a series of interim arrangements in place to manage car parking, pick up and drop off;</li> <li>We are working through the change in planning conditions and \$106 triggers that will be needed. These will required agreement from LBN and TfL and I will be arranging meetings with them soon; and</li> <li>Doesn't change the ATF role of reviewing and challenging the surface access projects.</li> </ul>

4.1	Business update attached to these minutes  HF / AF provided an update on the DLR visitor centre. The start date for the building work is intended to be 8 October 2019 and have an 8 week construction programme. The estimated opening date is early December 2019.	
	During the building work KAD will have staff within the concourse directing passengers on the use of contactless payment and ticket machines.	
	There are ongoing talks regarding the KAD/TfL contract extension to 2021. HF will provide update when this is concluded	HF

	He also set out the date for the completion of the footbridge between Factory Road and Albert road is intended to complete October 2019.

5.1	Draft Masterplan update	
	GW set out to the group that the airport is consulting with the local community at a series of events in July and September and that the consultation is open until 20th September. Following this the comments will be analysed with a view to publishing the Masterplan towards the end of this year.	
	Liftshare	
	GW outlined that the scheme had regular car sharing teams but the scheme now needed to look at ways to draw in non LCA employed staff (airlines and concessions) and also how more of the LCA operational staff could use the service. Shift rota seems to be the key in resolving availability to share.	
	Travel plans	
	GW updated group that this had been delayed due to some internal priorities but it was now back on target to be delivered as part of the planning commitments discharged through the resequencing programme.	
	Parking	
	No issues have been raised by the community representatives. This was reported to the last LCACC and no further points were raised.	
	Cycling	
	GW updated that LBN will be appointing a cycle lead to take forward the North Woolwich Road scheme. The airport will input to the this scheme to achieve a link from Hartmann Road to the cycle route.	
	Lime bikes are still awaiting to be appointed formally as the provider for the LBN scheme. The Airport has a space allocated and awaiting the provider to be appointed	
	Post meeting note: LBN report that Memorandum of Understanding is being finalised and they hope to have a scheme in place September 2019.

	GW set out that the Airport is still looking at the short-term link from Stratford to the airport via the DLR. In the longer term work withe C2E group is developing.

	The airport would like to look at opportunities for earlier services with TfL alongside the wider business community in the Royal Docks.	
	Provision of messaging in the Elizabeth Line trains / platforms for interchange to the Airport.

### **London City Airport Operations Update**

- Over 1.3 million passengers used London City Airport in Q2 2019 which is a 6.3% increase on the Q2 2018 figure. July 2019 has been the busiest ever month for the airport with 490,819 passengers who chose to travel from London City Airport.
- Local people we have seen 22% year-on-year rise in number of passengers who live within three miles of the airport (117, 000 in 2017 compared to 143,000 in 2018).
- In line with the UK Government's recent announcement, London City Airport
  committed to achieve net zero carbon emissions by 2050 as part of an
  industry wide announcement of 193 other European airports. This commitment
  is central to the airport's plans to help tackle the climate change challenge
  and operate sustainably and is in addition to the commitment to become
  carbon neutral by 2020.
- The airport, in partnership with the London Borough of Newham, hosted the second Royal Docks Meet the Buyer Event with around 250 representatives from 170 businesses in attendance. There were 25 buyers in attendance which are all based near to or working in London's Royal Dock.
- The airport received a highly commended for the 'Best Airport under 5 million award during ACI Europe's annual Conference.

#### New routes

- BA launched a new route between LCY and Split in Croatia.
- Air Antwerp launched a new route between LCY and Antwerp with operations starting from 9th September 2019.
- Unfortunately, TAP Air Portugal will suspend Lisbon and Porto operations from the end of October, attributable to overcapacity in the London-Lisbon and London-Porto markets.
