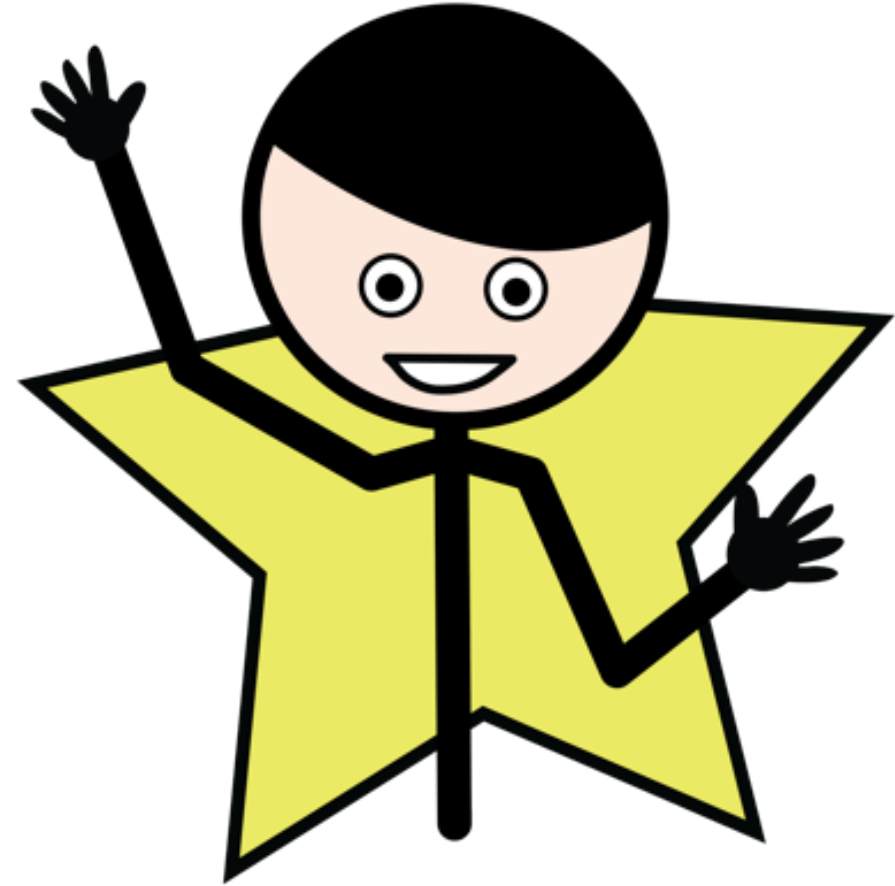
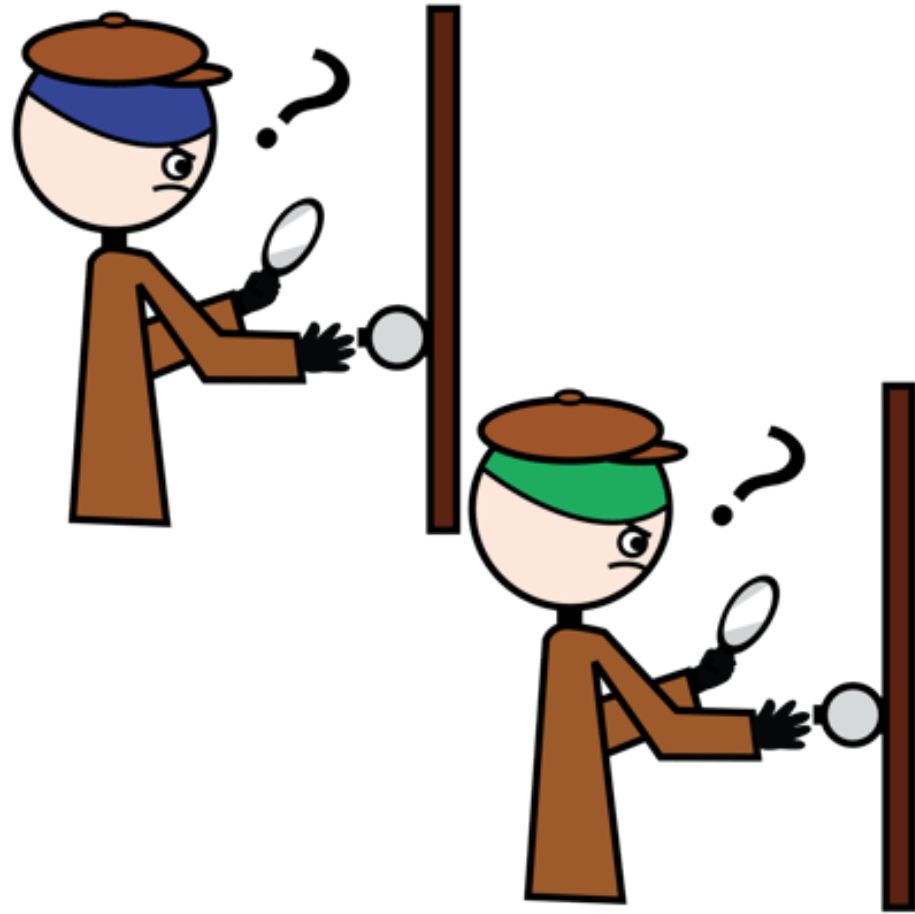
After traveling in the desert, God's people were about to enter their new home, a land filled with good things that God had promised to give them.



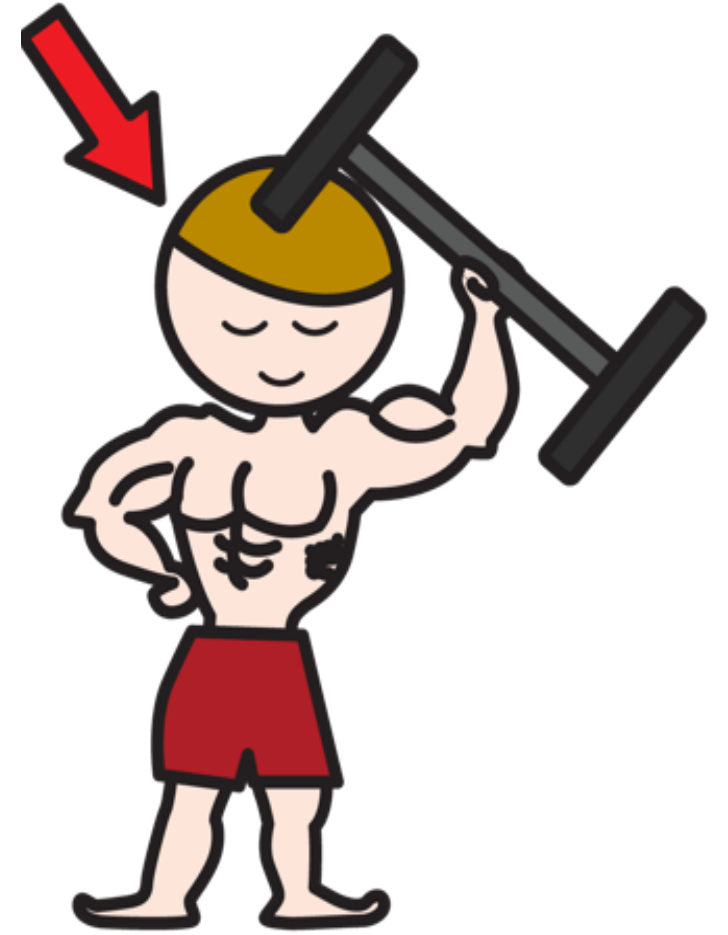
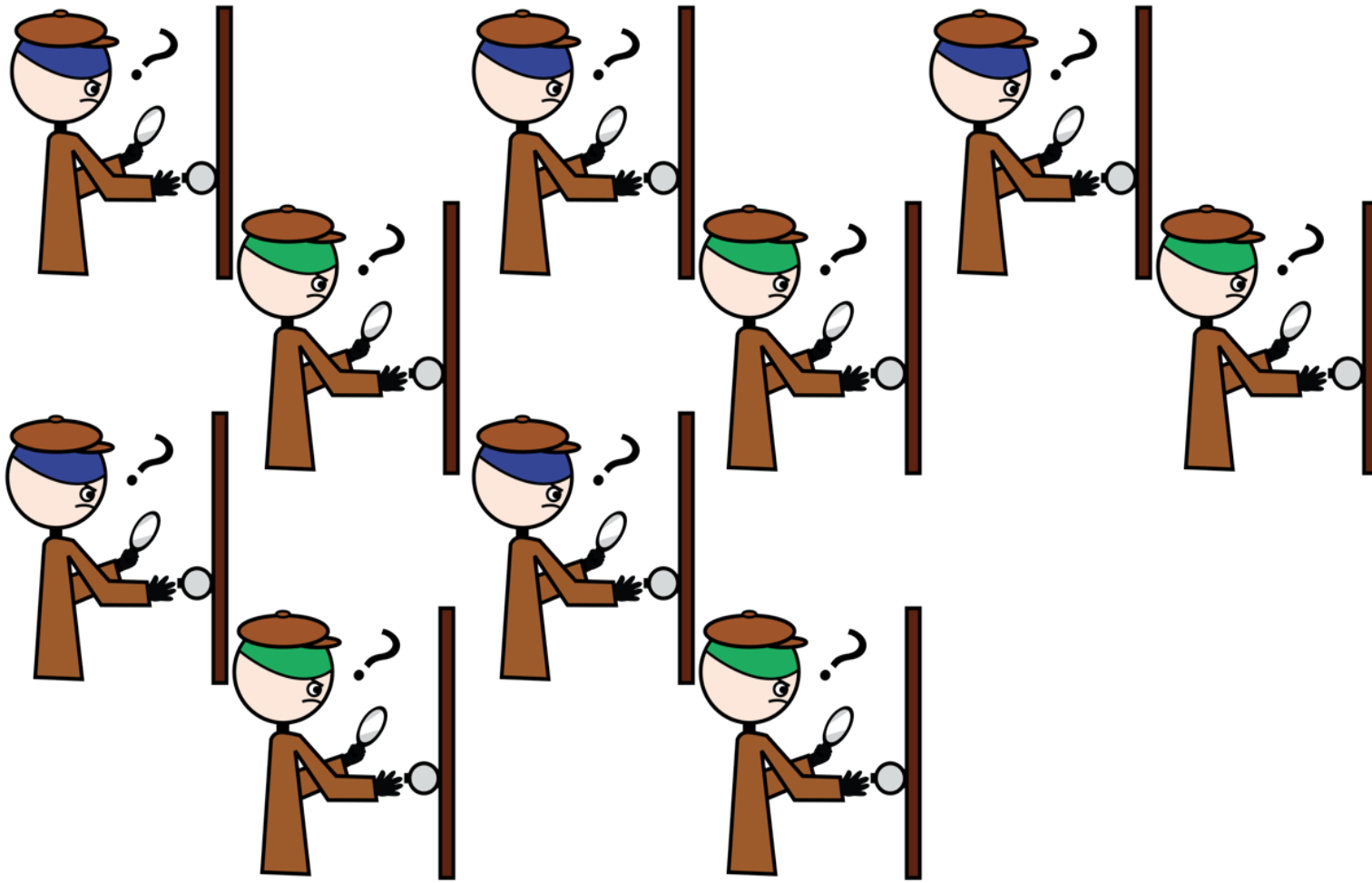
Before they went into the land, Moses sent 12 spies to get a report of what everything was like.



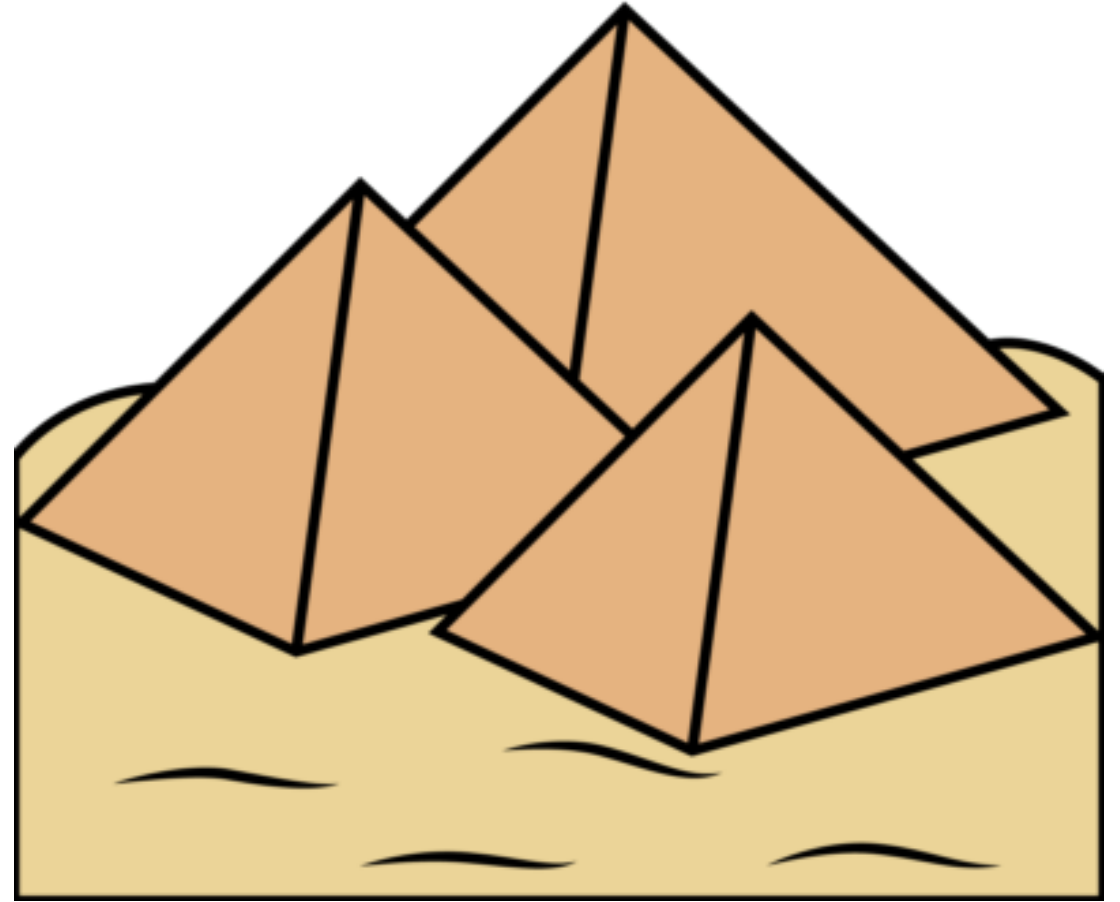
**The ten spies came back and said the land was full of cities
with big walls and scary giants!**



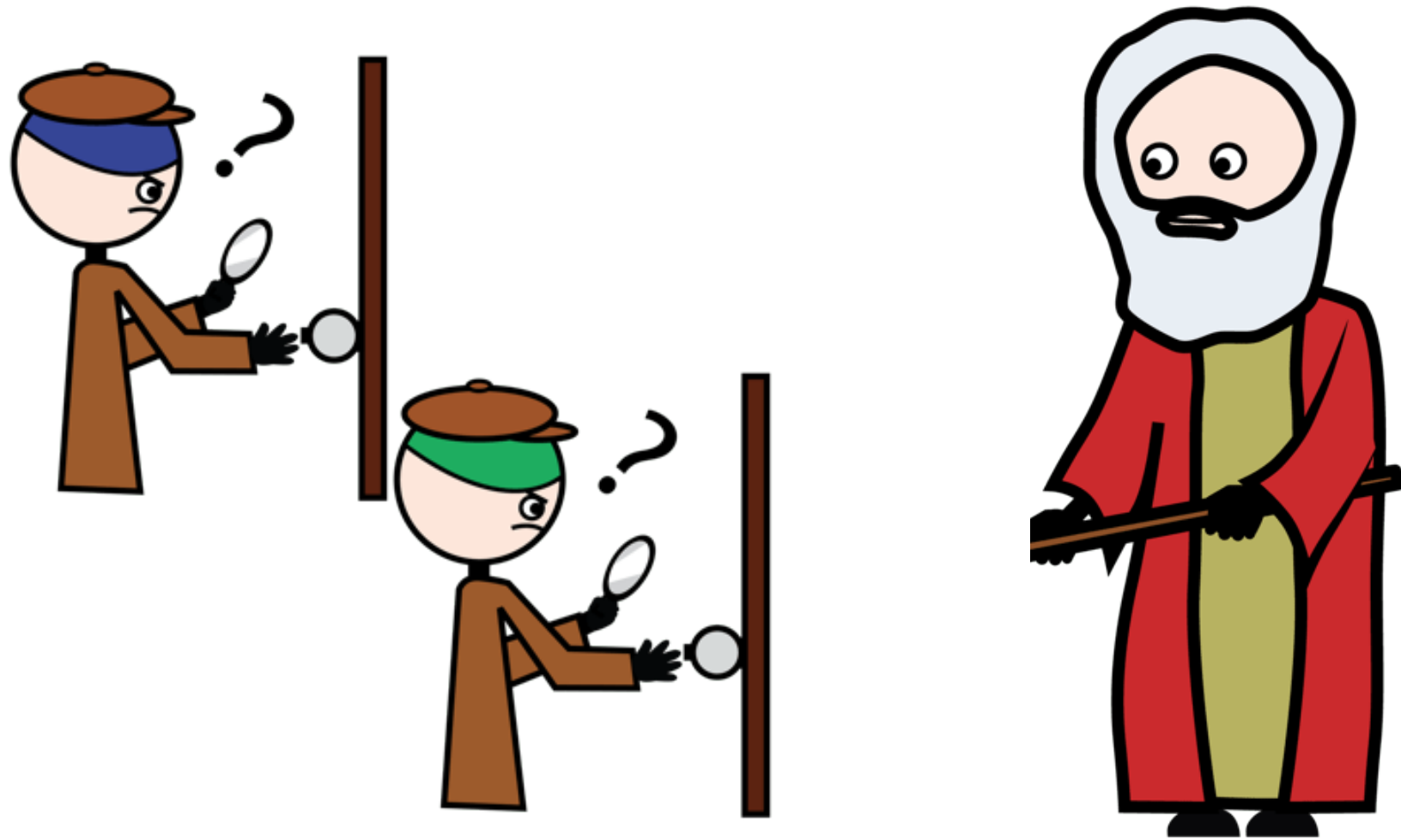
**Two spies named Joshua and Caleb came back and said

The ten spies disagreed and said there was no way they could go into the land. The people were stronger than they were.

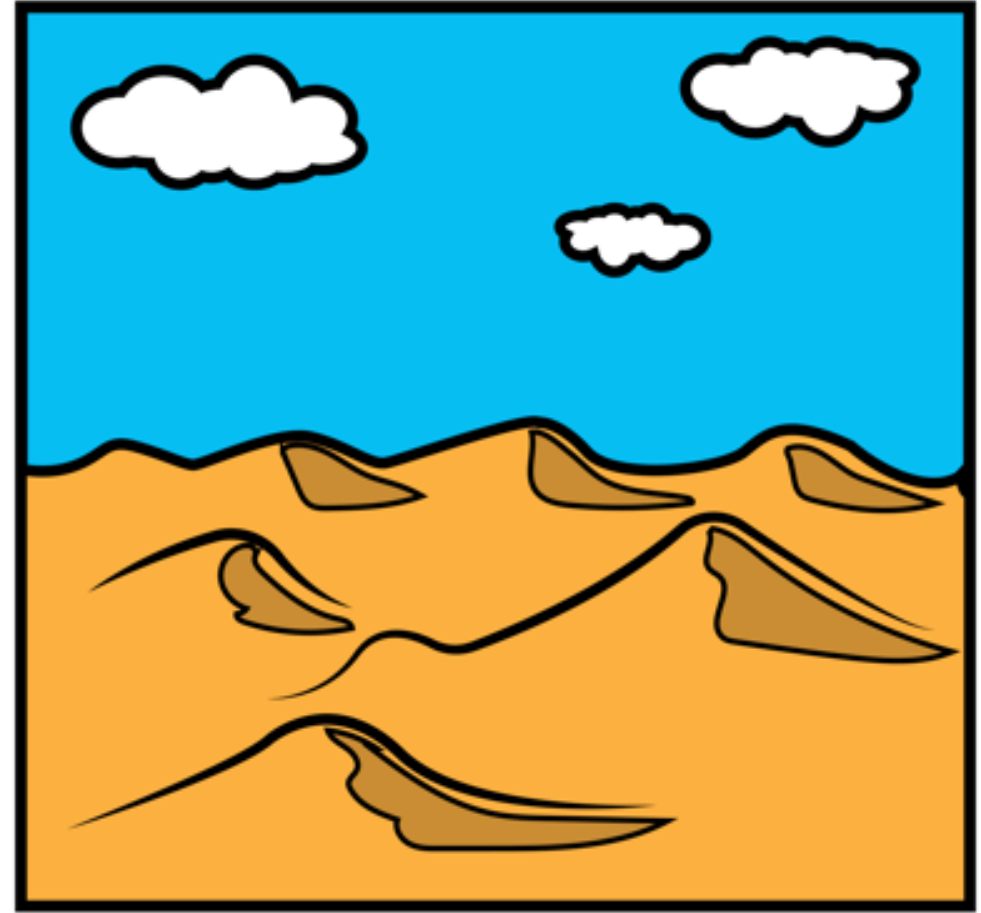


**This made God's people frightened! They didn't trust God.
They wanted to go back to Egypt.**

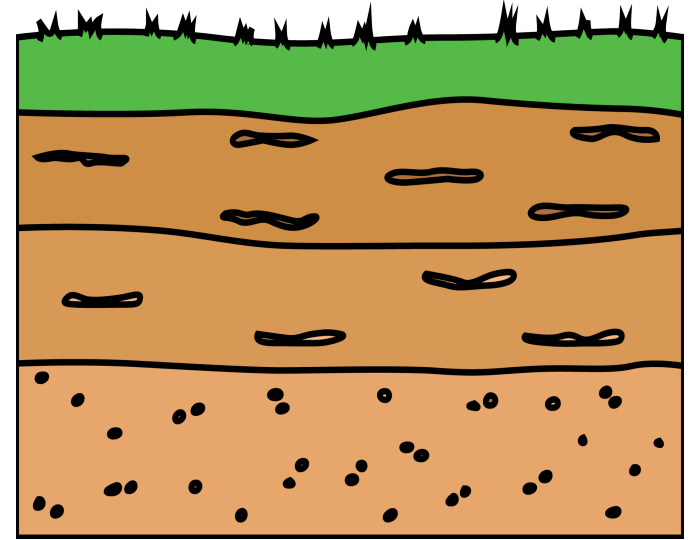
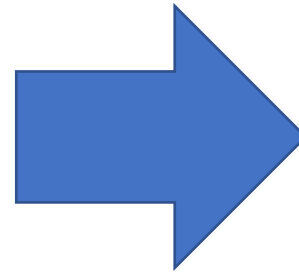


Moses, Joshua, and Caleb begged the people to remember that God was with them and was all-powerful. But the people would not listen. They refused to enter the land.

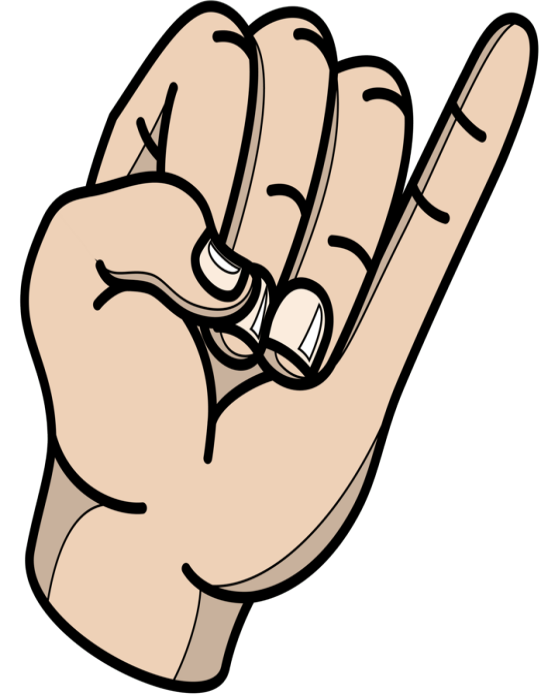
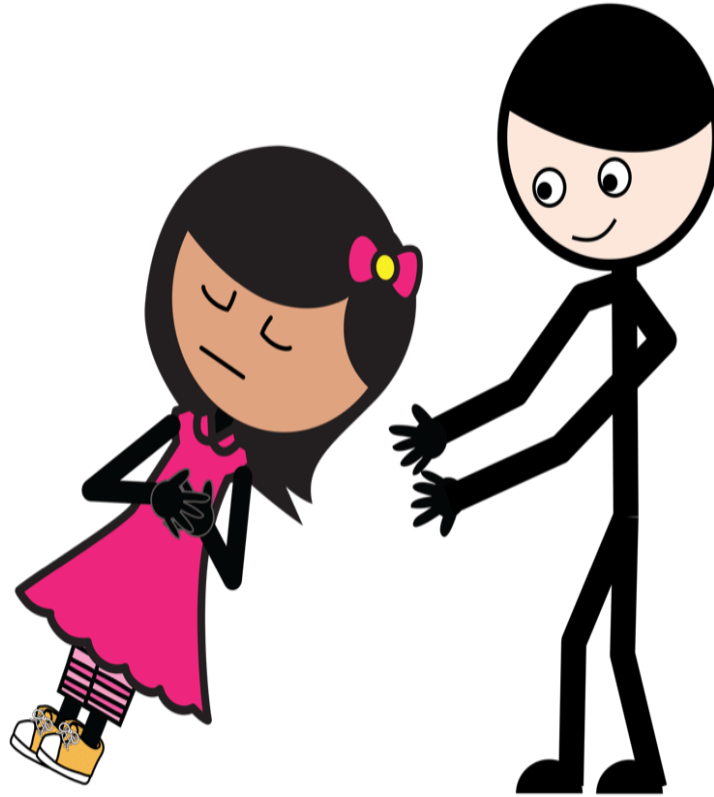
