SCRIPTURE: Genesis 39:1-5, 20-23; 41:14-16; 41:28-40; 45:4-11

FINISH LINE: Wisdom guides us in all situations

ACTIVITY 1: MEMORY VERSE GAME

SUPPLIES: Dominoes/Legos/Blocks, dry erase marker or sticker to write words on

SET UP: Write 2-3 words from this month's memory verse, James 3:17, on each object with a dry erase marker or place a sticker on the object and write on the sticker.

DIRECTIONS: Put all of your objects together in a pile and then unscramble them to write out this month's memory verse. After you have laid them out in order, read the verse all together. You can keep practicing by scrambling the words a few times and see if you can put the verse in order faster each time! If you are using items that can stack, see how tall of a tower you can build with the words in order.

MEMORY VERSE: "But, the wisdom from above is first of all pure. It is also peace loving, gentle at all times, and willing to yield to others. It is full of mercy and the fruit of good deeds. It shows no favoritism and is always sincere." James 3:17

ACTIVITY 2: LESSON REVIEW GAME

SUPPLIES: Blank paper, writing/coloring supplies

SET UP: Draw four boxes on a sheet of paper to create a comic strip.

DIRECTIONS: Everyone will get to create their own four-scene comic strips. Brainstorm a "hero" who is going to trust God to guide them in their situations. Help kids think of four different places the "hero" of their comic strips can seek and use wisdom from God. Give them time to draw their comic strips.

WRAP UP: After they have drawn their scenes, have them share their comic strip with the family. If you want to get extra creative, let them act out their scenes for each other. Ask them why the "hero" had to trust God to be their guide in each situation. Talk about situations each of you will be in this week where you will need godly wisdom to guide you and think of ways you can seek wisdom for those situations. Remember, wisdom comes from God and He will give it to us when we ask.
