David and Goliath

UNIT MEMORY VERSE:

"Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path." **Psalm 119:105**

UNIT: Kingdom

TEACHING TRUTH:

God always wins

READ: 1 Samuel 17:32-50

OPTIONAL: "David and Goliath" (pages 173-180) from <u>The Beginner's Bible</u>

WHAT DOES IT SAY? (OBSERVATION)

- 1. Why were the Israelites so afraid of the Philistine army? (They had a giant in their army named Goliath.)
- 2. Who did God send to fight the giant? (A shepherd boy named David)
- 3. What did David use to defeat Goliath? (He used a stone and his slingshot.) How was David able to defeat a giant this way? (God was more powerful than Goliath and God helped David defeat the giant.)

WHY DOES IT MATTER? (APPLICATION)

- When can we trust God? Can we trust God even when we are faced with a scary situation? (Yes! God is all-powerful, and we can always trust Him in any situation.)
- 2. What do you think God wants us to learn from this story? (Let your kids answer and then bring them back to this week's Teaching Truth. God always wins.)
- 3. Pray a short simple prayer thanking God that He is all-powerful and always wins.
