GENTLENESS – Week 1 Skit

Definition: Responding in a kind and careful way

Verse: Ephesians 4:2 (NLT) – "Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowances for each other's faults because of your love."

Week 1: God responds to us with gentleness.

Main Scripture: Psalm 23 (The Lord is our Shepherd)

Other Scriptures: Psalm 103

Characters:

Brewster - Sheep from New York, dramatic "Shep" the Shepherd - Calm and gentle

Props:

Meadow scenery Fence Collar Flashlight

At Home Suggestions:

- Choose an area in or around your house for the stage. This week is set outside, so try using your backyard if it's a nice day.
- Make sure whoever plays Shep has a staff. You can use a cane, a stick, a broom...get creative!
- Since Brewster is from New York, try your best New York accent when acting out the character!

Helpful Hints:

- Stage directions (what the characters are intended to do or how they are intended to act) are written in *ITALICS*.
- Take time reading through all of Psalm 23 together after acting out the skit.

SFX: Acoustic Nature

Brewster is asleep on the stage.

Shepherd: Come on, Brewster, it's time to wake up!

Brewster: Aww - 5 more minutes, Shep! (Rolls over and goes back to sleep)
```

Shepherd: Brewster, I already let you sleep 15 extra minutes. You need to wake up so we can catch up with the rest of the flock. They're already eating breakfast!

Brewster: I can skip breakfast. Just let me sleep already!

Shepherd: Do I need to get the staff?

Brewster: (Jumps up) No no, Shep! I'm up! I'm up! No need for the staff! (Stretches and then starts eating grass)

Shepherd: Thank you! Wait - what are you doing?

Brewster: You said everyone was eating breakfast. I'm hungry so I'm eating.

Shepherd: (Chuckles) Yes Brewster. They are eating breakfast, but not here. I found a better, greener pasture for you guys across the valley! There are even dandelions over there!

Brewster: Dandelions? You know how much I loooove dandelions...they're so pretty and they taste SOOO good!

Shepherd: Brewster, of course I know that, I'm your shepherd!

Brewster: Well, I can't leave without my lucky collar.

Shepherd: I've got it right here - see? (Puts it on Brewster) I have everything you will need for the day! Are you ready?

Brewster: Yeah yeah, alright. You said it was right over there?

Shepherd: It's just across the valley. Are you ready?

Brewster: (Entire bit incredibly dramatic) Across the valley?!?!? That's so far! You think I should walk all the way over there on an empty stomach? What if I pass out from hunger? What if I am sooo weak from starvation that I don't make it all the way there and I collapse on the way?

Shepherd: Brewster, I'm your shepherd. I will take care of you. If you get too tired, I'll let you rest in the meadow.

Brewster: Ugh, okay...but what if I get thirsty? It's starting to get hot you know with that sun coming up...

Shepherd: Well, we will take the path by the stream and if you get thirsty we can stop and get a drink of cool water.

Brewster: Really, Shep? Wow, you must really love me or something! I think maybe I'm your favorite of all the sheep. Don't worry - I won't tell any of the others.

Shepherd: (Chuckles) Alrighty, Brewster...come on now, let's go.

They start walking - Brewster stops suddenly and dramatically

Shepherd: Brewster, what's wrong?

Brewster: Oh...ummm...well, Shep, uh there's a small problem.

Shepherd: Ok, what's the problem?

Brewster: Well, umm you see, the problem is...(whispers because he is embarrassed) well the valley is a little dark.

Shepherd: Ohhhh, I see.....

Brewster: (Covering) But it's not like I'm afraid of the dark or anything! No, no, not me... I'm just a little concerned about things that might be hiding...in the dark...where I can't see them...(hides behind Shepherd).

Shepherd: Brewster, what have I told you about myself today?

Brewster: That...you're my shepherd?

Shepherd: That's right. Don't be afraid. I'm right here with you. Look - I even brought my flashlight just in case it gets too dark. And remember what else I have?

Brewster: Big muscles?

Shepherd: (Laughs) Besides my muscles, I have my staff! I can use it to protect you!

Brewster: Protect me? I thought you only used that to poke me when I don't wake up!

Shepherd: (Smiling) Well, it is good for that too. Come on, let's keep walking. Those dandelions are waiting for you!

Brewster: You're right! It's going to be soooo worth it when I get there. I can't wait to eat some fresh green grass and some giant dandelions...Oh hey, Shep?

Shepherd: Yeah?

Brewster: Do you think we could take a detour and go to the field where all those daisies are? That would be amazing, you know?

Shepherd: Not today, Brewster. We are already late, and the other sheep are waiting for us!

Brewster: (Getting upset) What? It's only an extra 3 minutes, Shep! It's not like they know what time we're going to be there anyway...ugh, fine. I'll just go without you! (Starts walking opposite direction)

Shepherd: Brewster, do you remember what happens when I have to discipline a sheep that runs away?

Brewster: (Hangs head) You gotta use that big ole stick...

Shepherd: Yes. Do I need to do that with you?

Brewster: NOOOOOO! No thank you! You know what, I'll admit it, I've put on a little fur, and I don't know if you're strong enough to carry me anymore...so, maybe the daisies aren't such a good idea after all.

Shepherd: Good decision, Brewster.

Brewster: Hey Shep? How come you're always so kind?

Shepherd: Well, I'm a shepherd. And us shepherds are known for our gentleness.

Brewster: Gentleness? Using that staff of yours is not what I would call gentle...

Shepherd: Well, Brewster, gentleness is responding in a kind and careful way. That means I'm going to be nice to you AND take care of you. Sometimes that means I have to discipline you, because I love you, and so that you learn the difference between what is good and what is harmful for you.

Brewster: Oooh...so you love me?!?! I'm your favorite sheep!!! (Winks dramatically). You want what is best for me so you respond to me with gentleness. I like it!

Shepherd: Hahah, very good! Do you know that God is the same way with us? God responds to us with gentleness. He leads us, comforts us, protects us, provides for us... like how I try to care for you and the other sheep!

Brewster: Wow, that's good news, Shep! I'm glad God responds to us with gentleness. And I'm thankful for you how show me what He's like.

Shepherd: Well, thank you, Brewster. Guess what? We are almost to the pasture! Are you hungry?

Brewster: OHHOHO...you bet I am! Hey - do you want to race the rest of the way there? On your mark, get set, GO!

Brewster and Shep run off the stage.
