There are consequences for not trusting God's plan



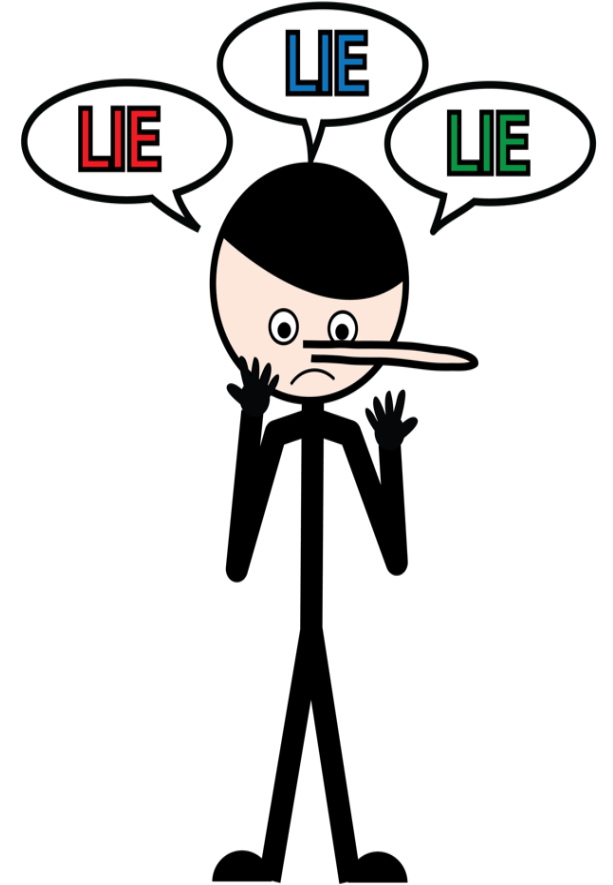
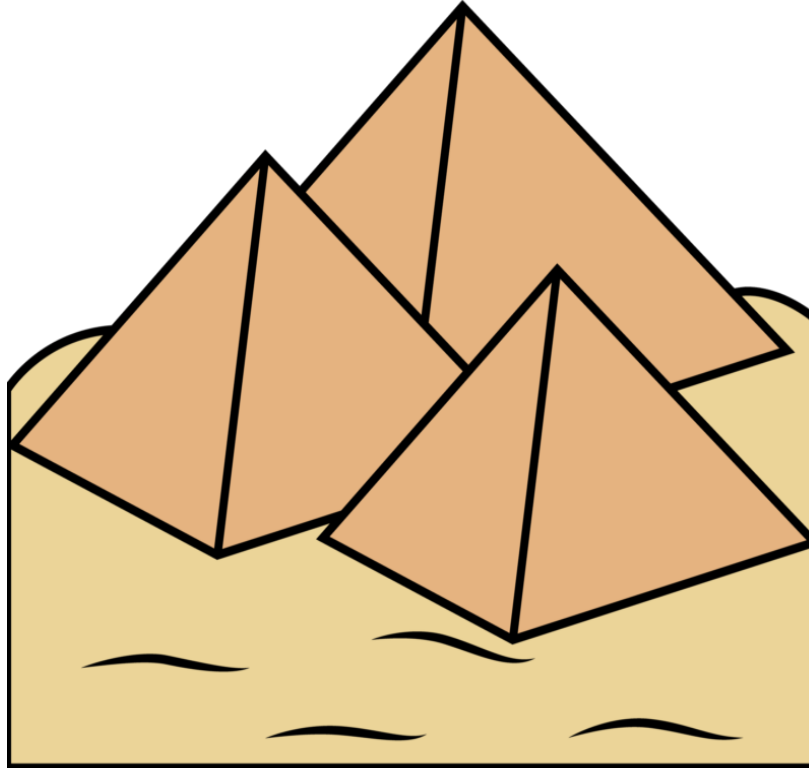
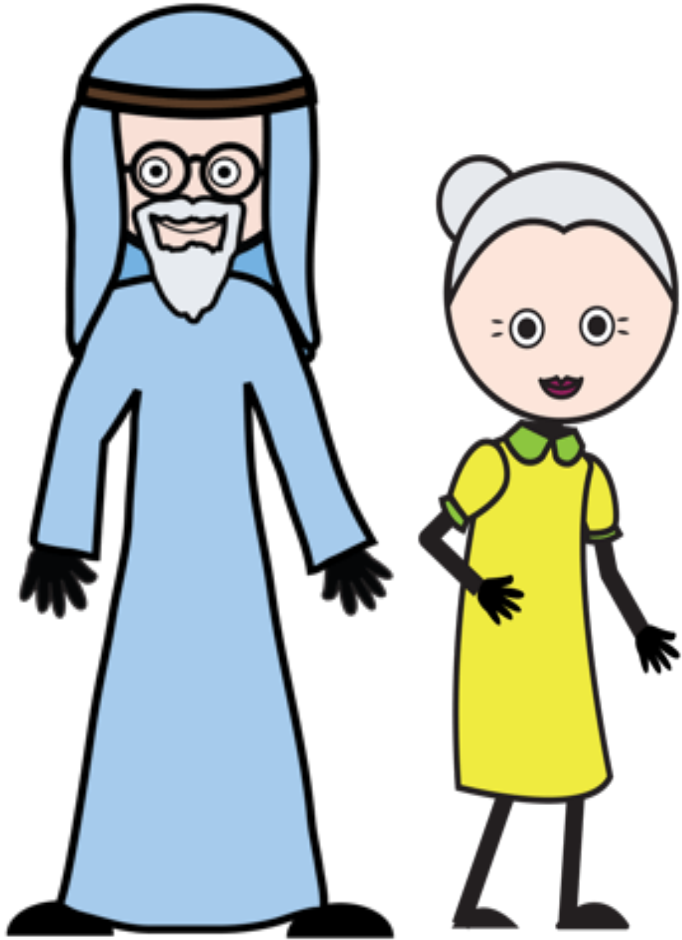
**God had a rescue plan to save the world from sin.
His plan started with a man named Abram.**



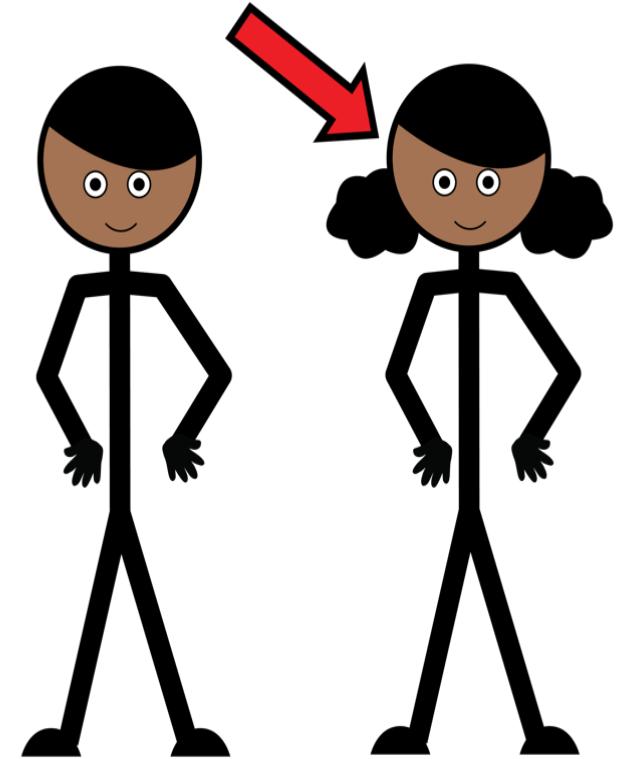
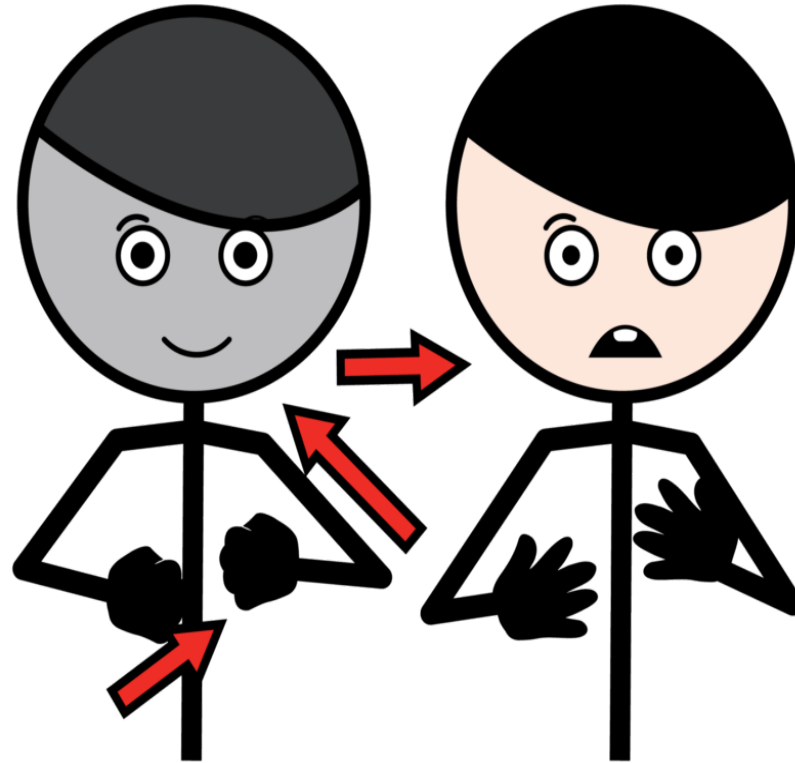
God asked Abram and his wife Sarai to move to a new land.



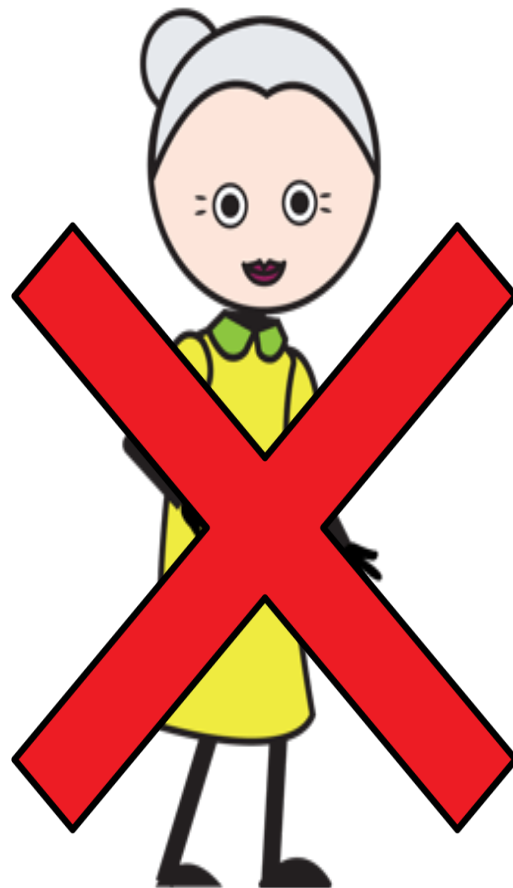
After they got to the new land, a famine, a time with little food, came to the land. Abram and Sarai left their new home to find food in Egypt.



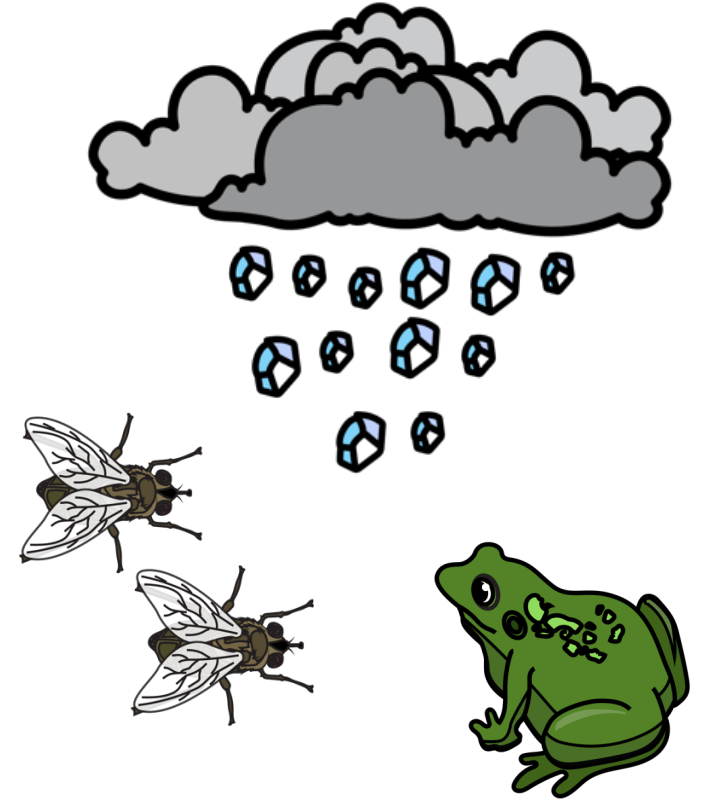
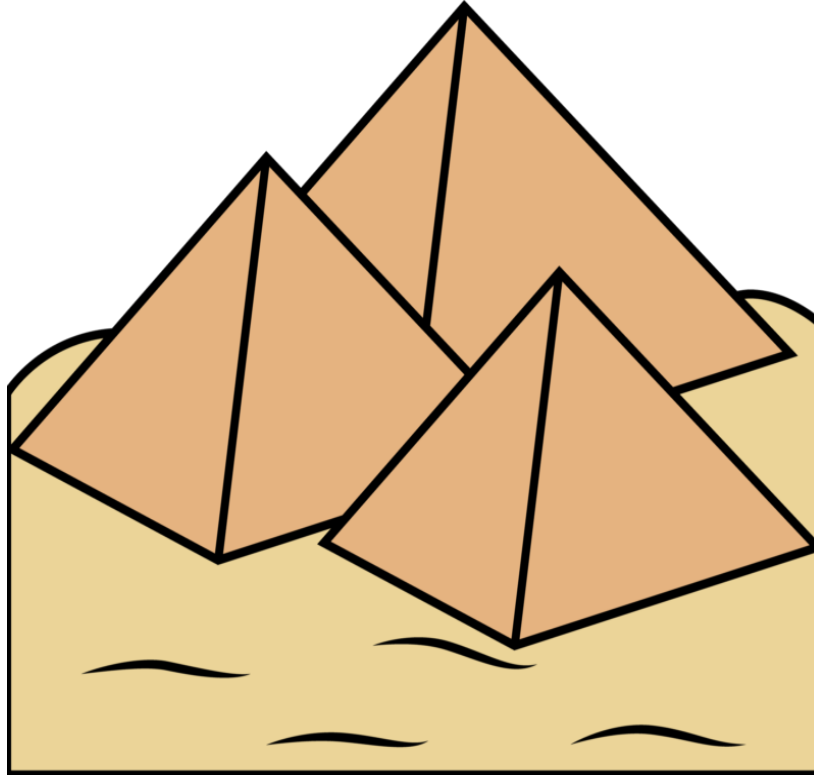
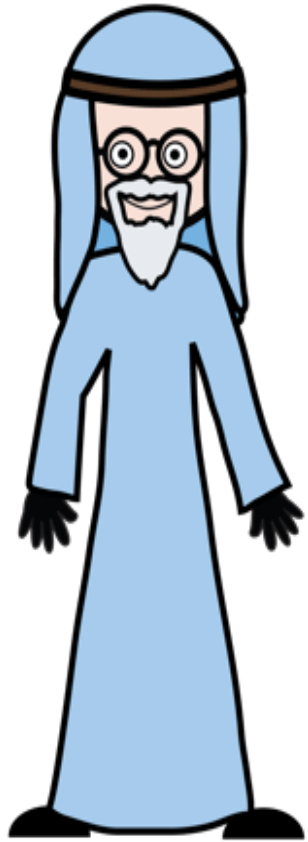
Before they got to Egypt, Abram asked Sarai to tell a lie.



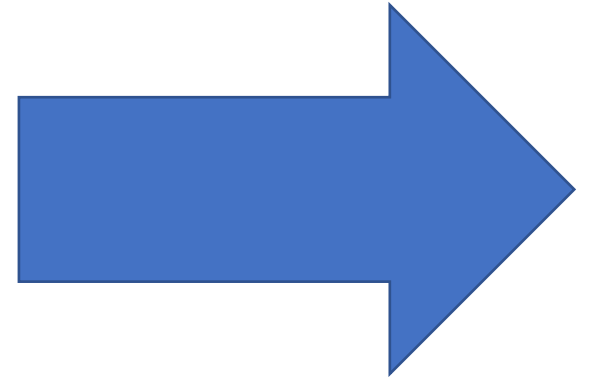
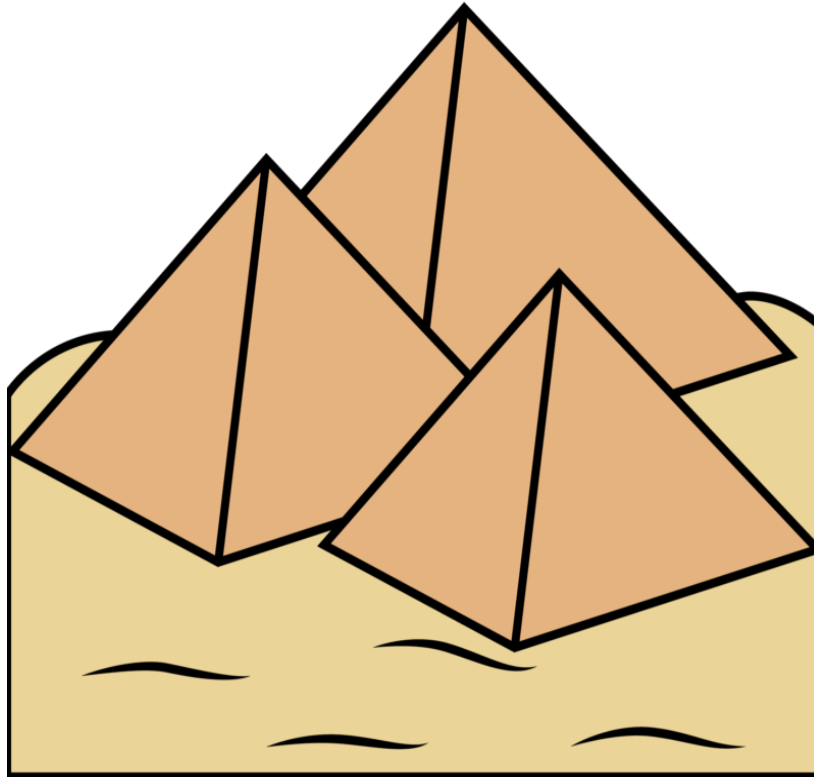

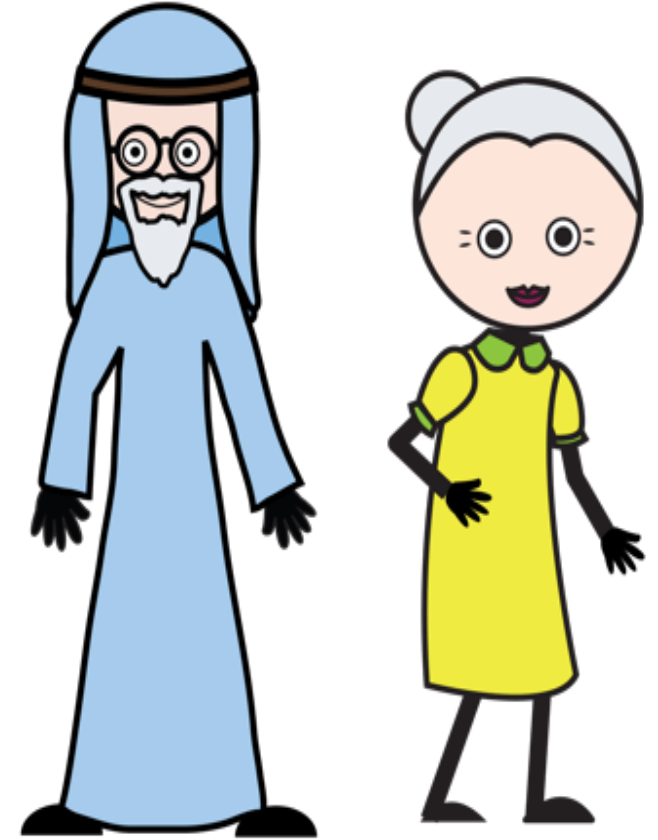
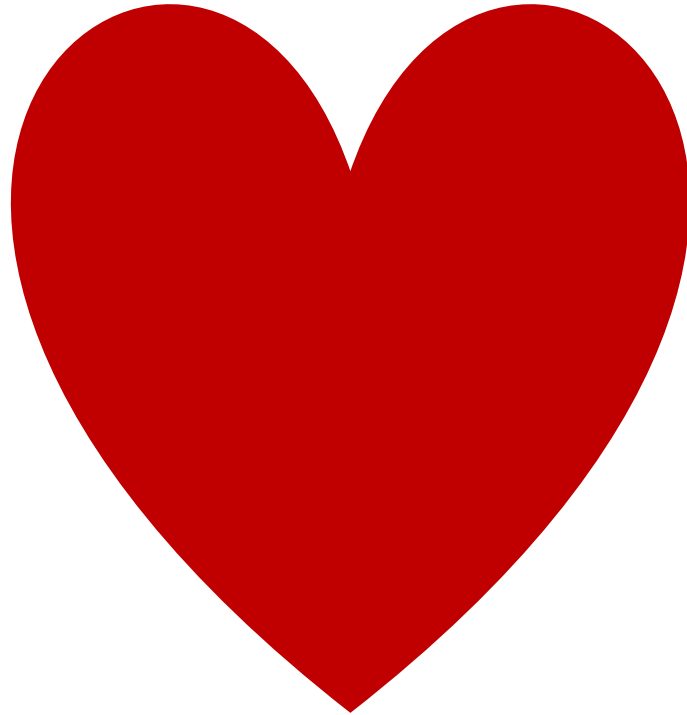
When they got to Egypt, the pharaoh tried to marry Sarai because of Abram's lie, but God stopped him.



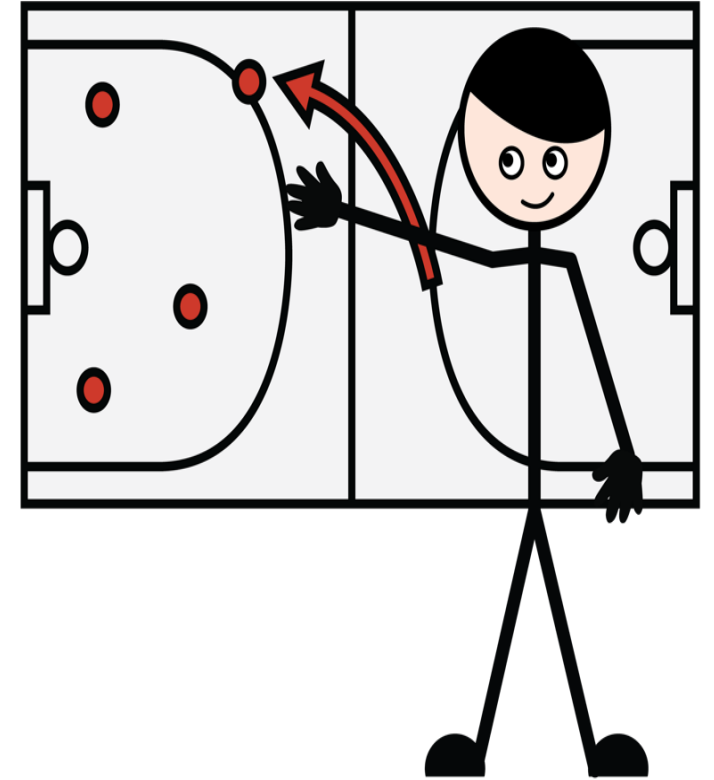
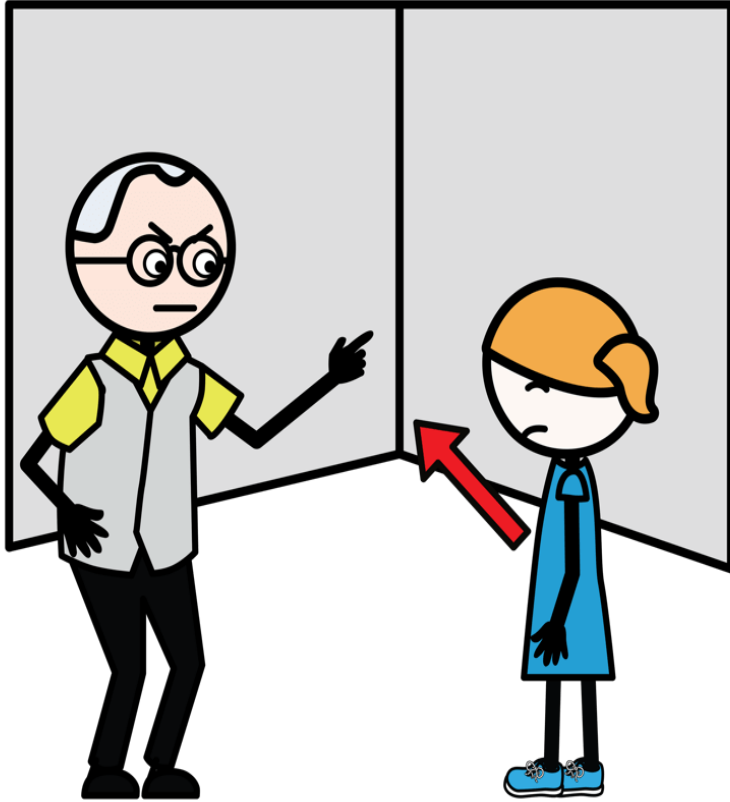
One of the consequences of Abram and Sarai's untrustworthiness was that the Egyptians suffered plagues.
