




This week's Teaching Truth: God is trustworthy even when we are not




Trustworthiness Being dependable without a doubt




Isaac, Abraham's son, grew up and married a woman named Rebekah. They had twin boys named Esau and Jacob.




Esau was a hunter and had red hair. Jacob was quiet and took care of things around the house.




Esau was Isaac's favorite son while Jacob was Rebekah's favorite.




When Isaac was very old and blind, he wanted to give Esau a special gift called a blessing.




Isaac asked Esau to bring him a special meal before he gave Esau the special blessing.



Rebekah heard the plan. She wanted Jacob to get the blessing.




Rebekah made the special meal for Jacob to take to Isaac. They did not trust God's plan.




Jacob tricked Isaac into giving the special gifts to him instead of Esau by pretending to be Esau.




This made Esau angry, so very angry that he wanted to hurt Jacob.




Jacob had to run away so Esau would not hurt him.
