



King Jehoshaphat was a good king who loved God. King Ahab was a bad king who did not love God.




King Ahab asked King Jehoshaphat to come with him to fight to get a city back that enemies had taken away from him.



King Jehoshaphat thought it might be a good idea to help, but he wanted to ask God first if it was the right thing to do.




King Ahab did not want to know what God wanted. He wanted to do things his way, not God's way.




King Ahab brought in 400 prophets to talk to God, but they really did not worship God at all.




The false prophets lied and said God wanted the kings to fight and that they would win.




King Jehoshaphat knew these prophets were lying and did not have integrity.






Macaiah spoke God's truth even when it was not popular.
