PRESCHOOL ACTIVITY GUIDE

TODAY'S STORY: Paul Meets Jesus (Acts 9:1-20)

TEACHING TRUTH: When Jesus changes our lives, we want to tell others about Him

ACTIVITY 1: STORY REVIEW – God Forgave

SUPPLIES: None

- 1. Two family members hold hands and raise them above their heads.
- 2. The others will line up and march under the "bridge" while singing the song to the tune of "London Bridge."
- 3. The 2 people making up the bridge will lock up, or drop their hands around, the person going under the bridge the second time the song says, "Saul was mean."
- 4. Let the person go when the song says, "God forgave him."
- 5. Once a person gets locked up, let them switch places with one of the people making the bridge.
- 6. Continue until everyone has been locked up and gotten a chance to be the bridge.

SONG:

Saul was mean But God forgave God forgave Saul was mean (lock up) But God forgave (let go) God forgave him

ACTIVITY 2: TEACHING TRUTH REVIEW - When Jesus changes our lives, we want to tell others about Him

SUPPLIES: Paper plate cut in half, 1 craft stick, crayons, tape, mirror (optional)

- 1. Give your child the paper plate half and crayons.
- 2. On one side of the plate, have your child draw a mean mouth. Make sure the flat part of the plate is at the top.
- 3. On the other side of the plate, have your child draw a happy mouth.
- 4. Tape the craft stick to the plate.
- 5. Retell a simple version of the story from Acts 9:1-20.
- 6. As you tell the story, have your child hold his plate to his mouth, starting with the mean side facing out.
- 7. When you talk about the part where Saul meets Jesus, have your child flip the face from mean to happy.
- 8. Remind your child that when Jesus changes our lives, we want to tell others about Him.
- 9. OPTIONAL: Show your child a small mirror so he can see his face when it changes from mean to happy.

ACTIVITY 3: MEMORY VERSE REVIEW – Psalm 107:1 – Musical Shapes

SUPPLIES: Memory verse song (on the Preschool Kids Kit page), paper (one piece per person), markers/crayons

- 1. If you have different colors of paper, draw different shapes on each page with a black marker or cut them into different shapes. If you only have white paper, draw different shapes on each page using different colors.
- 2. Make a circle on the floor with all the pieces of paper and have each person stand on one page.
- 3. Explain that they are going to sing along with the song and walk on the pages as the music plays.
- 4. When the song is at the end of the verse, stop the song. Each person should be standing on one page.
- 5. Call out a color. Whoever is standing on that color will shout out the verse address. (Psalm 107:1)
- 6. Repeat until all colors have been called. If you want to keep practicing, continue playing the song and call out different shapes when you stop the music.
