

PRESCHOOL ACTIVITY GUIDE

TODAY'S STORY: Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet

TEACHING TRUTH: Jesus is the greatest example of serving others

ACTIVITY 1: TEACHING TRUTH REVIEW – Jesus is the greatest example of serving others

SUPPLIES: Construction paper, markers, scissors

- 1. Help your child make a coupon book so she can practice following Jesus' example of serving others.
- 2. Grab a sheet of construction paper. Help your child fold it in half and then half again to create four squares.
- 3. At the top of each square write "I choose to serve you by..." and leave space for your child to draw a picture of how she can serve someone else.
- 4. Help your child think about different ways she can serve someone else this week. (Examples: Water the plants, pick up dirty clothes, throw away trash, etc.) Let her draw a picture of one way to serve others in each square.
- 5. After your child is done drawing, cut the squares apart, stack them together, and staple them along one side to make a small book.
- 6. Over the next week, have your child use the coupons to serve others.

ACTIVITY 2: STORY REVIEW – Washing Feet

SUPPLIES: A bowl of water, a washcloth, a towel

- 1. Review this week's story and remind everyone that Jesus gave us an example to follow. He served His disciples by washing their feet.
- 2. Have everyone remove their socks and shoes.
- 3. Using the washcloth and bowl of water, wash the first person's feet and then dry them with the towel.
- 4. Switch spots until everyone has had a chance to be the servant and all feet have been washed.
- 5. After everyone's feet are clean, remind them that Jesus is the greatest example of serving others. We can follow His example and serve others, too.

ACTIVITY 3: MEMORY VERSE REVIEW – Matthew 22:37 & 39 – Hot Potato

SUPPLIES: Memory verse song (on the Preschool Kids Kit page), a ball

- 1. Sit in a circle on the floor.
- 2. Explain that you will sing along with the memory verse song and carefully pass the ball while the music plays.
- 3. Stop the music when the verse is over.
- 4. Whoever has the ball when the music stops will stand and shout the verse address (Matthew 22:37 & 39).
- 5. OPTION: Instead of using the song, a grownup can say the verse one word at a time. With each word, pass the ball to the next person. Whoever has the ball at the end will stand and say the verse address.
