TODAY'S STORY: Isaiah

TEACHING TRUTH: God promised to send a Savior

ACTIVITY 2: STORY REVIEW — Isaiah Says

SUPPLIES: None

1. Isaiah's job was to listen to God's messages and then share those messages with others. One of the most important messages God wanted Isaiah to share was that **God promised to send a Savior**. Let's play a game to help us practice listening.
2. Play "Simon Says" but switch it up and say, "Isaiah says," before you give them an action to do. If you do not say, "Isaiah says," before an action but someone does the action anyway, they are out.
3. After you play a few rounds, remind everyone that just as they followed what "Isaiah said" in the game, God wanted His people to listen to Isaiah and believe the messages they heard.

ACTIVITY 2: TEACHING TRUTH REVIEW — God promised to send a Savior

SUPPLIES: A piece of paper, crayons or markers, craft supplies

1. Explain to your child that in Bible times people wrote important messages on scrolls. Isaiah shared the messages God gave him with others and wrote them down on scrolls so they could always be remembered. Let them know that they will get to make a scroll to help them remember that God made amazing promises that are still true today.
2. Give your child a piece of paper and help them write, "**God promised to send a Savior**," on it.
3. Allow them to decorate the paper however they choose with markers, crayons, stickers, etc.
4. Have your child crinkle up their paper in a ball. Then, help them smooth it out and carefully roll it into a scroll.
5. Let your child practice sharing the message that **God promised to send a Savior** using the scroll they made.

ACTIVITY 3: MEMORY VERSE REVIEW – John 3:16 – Musical Shapes

SUPPLIES: Memory verse song (on the Preschool Kids Kit page), paper (one piece per person), markers/crayons

1. If you have different colors of paper, draw different shapes on each page with a black marker, or cut them into shapes. If you only have white paper, draw different shapes on each page using different colors.
2. Make a circle on the floor with all the pieces of paper and have each person stand on one page.
3. Explain that they are going to sing along with the song and walk on the pages as the music plays.
4. When the song is at the end of the verse, stop the song. Each person should be standing on one page.
5. Call out a color. Whoever is standing on that color will shout out the verse address (John 3:16).
6. Repeat until all colors have been called. If you want to keep practicing, continue playing the song and call out different shapes when you stop the music.
