





II. Bidding/Proposing

- Attend Pre-Bid or Pre-Proposal Meeting
- Submit questions in writing
- Communication between Pre-Bid/Pre-Proposal Attendee and Bid/Proposal Preparer
- Proofread bid/proposal response before submitting for compliance with Business Diversity requirements

III. Forms and/or Evaluation Criteria

- Complete and sign all required forms
- Provide exact dollar amounts and percentages for Diversity participation as requested
- Do not use "TBD" or "Up to a certain percentage"
- RFPs: Respond to Evaluation Criteria (20 points)
- Submit applicable and current Certification Certificates

IV. Responsive versus Non-Responsive

- Responsive determinations move forward in the evaluation and consideration process
- Non-responsive determinations do not move forward.






