Who doesn't love an online shopping deal? <u>Prebook parking online</u>, or on the <u>DFW mobile app</u>, to save up to 50% off drive-up prices.

- → *Tip*: Book early to secure the best rates and product availability.
- → *Trick*: Create your MyDFW account to prebook faster, manage bookings and receive specials and discounts.

4. Be Toll Tag ready

If you haven't already prebooked your parking, using your toll tag to enter and exit the airport is the easiest and quickest. Next best back-up plan are contactless options like Apple Pay and Google Pay.

5. Arrive early so you're not late for the festivities

Arriving two hours before a flight is recommended for all customers, especially during the busy holiday season.

→ Tip: Adding an extra buffer of time is also never a bad idea to keep joy in everyone's world.

6. Check your drivetime options, so you can jingle all the way
