## **Current BBQ use Guidelines**

- 1. Permit shall be kept on premises near grilling site and shall be readily available for inspection.
- 2. Only propane-fueled grills will be allowed for use, not to exceed a 20lb. cylinder by approval of Fire Marshal / Designee.
- 3. Deep-fat fryers or large hot-oil type cooking devices shall be prohibited from use.
- 4. Cooking devices shall not be operated on combustible balconies or within 10 feet of any combustible structure and/or combustible materials.
- 5. No open flame device shall be allowed use inside of a building.
- 6. Dependent on wind velocity and direction, grills may need to be located further than 10 feet of any building opening, door, or other penetration into the building, such as vents, etc.
- 7. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher with a minimum 4-A rating shall be available for immediate utilization at the grilling site.
- 8. Open flame devices shall be constantly attended by a responsible person until the fire is completely extinguished.
- 8. Grills or other cooking devices shall be maintained in a serviceable condition.
- 9. The location of the cooking device shall be approved by the Fire Marshal / Designee. Moving the device from its approved location will be grounds for immediate permit revocation.
- 10. When not in use, the propane cylinder shall be disconnected from the cooking device. Both propane cylinder and grill shall be stored in a suitable location approved by the Fire Marshal / Designee.
- 11. Violation of the terms of this permit may result in issuance of a Municipal Citation and/or permanent removal of the grill from the Airport.
- 12. Utilizing any open-flame cooking device without a permit shall result in issuance of a Municipal Citation.
- 13. Any deviations from these guidelines must have prior written approval of the Fire Marshal / Designee.

## Additional Requirements for Locations on the Airfield Operations Area (AOA):

- Recreational grilling permits will be issued only in conjunction with Special Events and must gain approval of the Fire Marshal / Designee..
- 2. Open flames, flame-producing devices and other sources of ignition shall not be permitted in any location within 50 feet of an aircraft.
- 3. Open flames, flame-producing devices and other sources of ignition shall not be permitted within 50 feet of any fueling operation, fuel hydrant pit, or other sources of hydrocarbon fuels.
- 4. Under no circumstance shall cooking operations be allowed under the Terminal Building Level 1, on the Terminal Building Level 3, or any other location not approved by the Fire Marshal / Designee.
- 5. The permit holder shall notify Terminal Management and other tenants and concessionaires in the area of the grilling activity.
- Fixed or stationery grills, which are plumbed to a permanent fuel source, shall meet the Adopted Building and Fire
  Codes. Such fixed grills shall be exempt from permitting, however all other applicable safety guidelines listed in this document shall be followed.
- 7. Violating any of these additional requirements on the AOA may result in issuance of a Municipal Citation and/or permanent removal of the grill from the Airport.
