INDUSTRY NEED

Overall employment in business and financial occupations is projected to grow faster than the average for all occupations from 2022 to 2032. For example, the need for Financial Analysts will grow by 8% by 2032, adding 29,000 jobs to the workforce.

CURRICULUM

NAF's <u>Future Ready Learning</u> hosts a wide array of instructional content vetted by industry experts, post-secondary instructors, and professional organizations. The <u>Academy of Finance</u> curriculum includes:

- Courses in Finance, Accounting, Entrepreneurship, and Insurance Authentic learning projects that address real-world issues in partnership with career experts like <u>Finance Expeditions</u>
- On-demand resources from the Council for Economic Education and Next-Gen Personal Finance

Essential partners supporting NAF's Academy of Finance curriculum include KPMG, Truist Bank, Florida International University - College of Business, American Accounting Association (AAA), Association of International Certified Professional Accountants (AICPA), Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship (NFTE), and Council for Economic Education.

WORK-BASED LEARNING

Industry professionals play a significant role in helping students see the connections between high school and the world of work. NAF collaborates with major corporations, post-secondary institutions, and local companies to provide career readiness and work-based learning experiences throughout the academy experience.

Students connect directly with finance professionals to learn first-hand about careers in this industry and determine how their strengths and interests might be a good fit. Adults act as role models and guides to students, helping them develop the skills they will need to thrive in their future careers, navigate pathways to get there, and help them start building their professional network to open doors of opportunity. Businesses that collaborate with NAF academies play an active and integral role in shaping the future workforce and building their own local talent.
