





NAF APPROACH

NAF's design focuses on connecting the classroom to the workplace by integrating career-focused curricula and authentic-learning projects into the traditional high school experience and offering realworld application opportunities. With a rigorous program of study and a progressive workbased learning continuum of activities designed to build career awareness, exploration, and preparation, students gain the skills and knowledge needed to make informed choices and be successful in their future careers.





INDUSTRY NEED

Overall employment in business and financial occupations is projected to grow faster than the average for all occupations from 2023 to 2033. For example, the need for Financial Analysts will grow by 9% by 2033, adding nearly 31,000 jobs each year, on average, to the workforce.

CURRICULUM

NAF's Future Ready Learning hosts a wide array of instructional content vetted by industry experts, post-secondary instructors, and professional organizations. The Academy of Finance curriculum includes:

- Courses in Finance, Accounting, Entrepreneurship, and Insurance
- A new instructional unit launching in July called AI in the Finance Industry.
- Authentic learning projects called **NAF Expeditions** that focus on navigating a career in accounting, sports data analytics, and cryptocurrency.
- On-demand resources from organizations like Everfi, Federal Reserve Education, Next Gen Personal Finance (NGPF), and FutureAccountants.org.

Essential organizations (or industry leaders) supporting NAF's Academy of Finance curriculum include KPMG, Truist Bank, American Accounting Association (AAA), Association of International Certified Professional Accountants (AICPA), Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship (NFTE), Junior Achievement, and the Council for Economic Education.

WORK-BASED LEARNING

Industry professionals play a significant role in helping students see the connections between high school and the world of work. NAF collaborates with major corporations, post-secondary institutions, and local companies to provide career readiness and workbased learning experiences throughout the academy experience.

Students connect directly with finance professionals to learn first-hand about careers in this industry and determine how their strengths and interests might be a good fit. Adults act as role models and guides to students, helping them develop the skills they will need to thrive in their future careers, navigate pathways to get there, and help them start building their professional network to open doors of opportunity.
