NAF ACADEMY WEBSITE GUIDE

The NAF Academy Website Guide is a great resource for anyone looking to create a website to showcase their NAF academy. Regardless of whether your academy already has its own website or is featured on your high school's website, this guide provides valuable content to help you accurately describe your academy.

Building a NAF academy website is an excellent way for students to develop their future ready skills, regardless of the academy pathway they are in. Make sure to include hyperlinks to relevant content on naf.org so that users can learn more and <u>download NAF logos</u> to use on your website, or <u>request a custom</u> NAF academy logo if you don't already have one. By linking your messaging and branding to the national NAF Network, you can establish credibility for your academy and attract students, business partners, community leaders, and donors.

Tips

Before you get started, here are some simple tips to improve the user experience of your website:

- Consider making your website mobile-friendly. As you create content, it's important to keep checking how the content displays on a mobile screen. You can do this by testing a preview of the page on a mobile device or on desktop by right-clicking on the page, clicking Inspect, and toggling between screen sizes at the top left of the developer panel that appears on the right.
- Improve your website's accessibility and SEO by describing the action you'd like your user to take on buttons or hyperlinks. Instead of using phrases like "click here" or "learn more", use more actionspecific language like "learn about our academy". When adding photos to your website, don't forget to include alt text. This not only helps folks who are using screenreaders to visualize your content but also helps with making your website more discoverable on search engines.
- Use high-resolution images that showcase how your academy benefits students and the community. These can include pictures of work-based learning activities, students interacting with each other, cheerful group photos, and volunteer activities. To help with branding, you may also consider using photos that include the NAF logo as a banner or merch. If you need help obtaining a banner or NAF merchandise, don't hesitate to reach out to your Portfolio Manager.

How to Refer to Your NAF Academy

When creating a website, it's important to prioritize the look and feel of your homepage and organize your content into sections that can be easily navigated through a main menu. The main menu displays on each webpage while on desktop and as a "hamburger" while on mobile.

Group your content into sections based on what folks might look for, like learning about who you are or how to get involved. Each section may include subsections as individual pages, if you wish – consider the user experience. If you plan to share specific content, like a list of academy pathways that you offer, consider making it its own page.

Here are website sections we recommend:

Section 1: HOMEPAGE

The homepage is the perfect place to give an overview of who you are, your highlights, recent news and announcements, and calls to action. You can take inspiration from nafe.org or <a href="mailto:mailto

 and industries that they may not otherwise have known about (and the skills needed to be successful in
 those areas). <u>Outcomes-Driven Work-Based Learning</u> activities throughout the <u>NAF Student Journey</u> fall
 on a continuum building from career awareness, to career exploration, then finally career preparation.
